Is that plant hardy?

Gardeners in Southern Ontario must and do ask this question of all plants they wish to grow as durable fixtures in their gardens. They ask this question because they have managed to exterminate some excellent plants they found while on plant expeditions or they have chosen to listen to experience before heading into a second mortgage on their homes when considering landscaping.

What is a hardy plant? When a gardener says a plant is hardy he or she refers to the ability of a plant to survive in our climate with our without specific care or protection. This could refer to a plants ability to survive cold winters, drought conditions, fluctuations, temperature basically anything that is detrimental to the plants well being.

The true meaning of plant hardiness is the plants biological programming to live in the particular climate or its adaption to particular climate. Horticulturalists have for many years relied on the hardiness zone map which serves as a guide for registering a plants hardiness according to the average mean temperature of a given area. Ours being zones 5 to 5b (average mean temperature of -23 C or -10 F for 210 days) depending on

Experienced gardeners are like detectives (myself being Colombo), when handed tid-bits of information and expected to counsel in an intelligent manner. Gather the facts and choose wise-

When you are pondering a plant for a certain location you must remember that each plant has its own needs to succeed. It is important that you go to the nursery with an open mind about what plant will work as opposed to the plant that you want! If the shoe fits wear it, but if you desire a certain plant and it is ques-. tionable as to whether its site is the proper one, don't plant it in the wrong location, only to have it deteriorate before your eyes. In my opinion, when you are contemplating a certain area to plant first think of the functions of this plant and then findout what plants will fit the scenario. Then by process of elimination choose the flora dejour.


