P.O.W.E.R. says, NOW is the time to influence what the Ontario NDP government will do in the next year. This Saturday, Sunday and Monday, the NDP will hold a convention at the Harbour-Castle Weston in Toronto.

At this convention, policy will be made and priorities set. P.O.W.E.R. invites all those who care about the direction the pro-

vince is taking on landfill and protection of the escarpment to make your voices heard at a demonstration in Toronto, Saturday, March 2nd at 11 a.m.

P.O.W.E.R. has invited representatives of other groups such as ICE, Greensville Against Serious Pollution (GASP) and Picking Ajax Citizens Together (PACT) to join the demonstration to remind the NDP of the positions they have stated in the past.

The new Ontario government is under tremendous pressure to water down previously held policies or to back away from them all together. NOW is the time to remind the NDP before the legislature goes back on March 18th that they must stick to past commitments and STOP THE DUMP.

On Saturday, P.O.W.E.R. will have a bus that leaves MacKenzie-Smith School (Lions Pool) on Acton Blvd. at 9:30 a.m., picking up at the Civic Centre in Georgetown to leave there by 10 a.m.

What Is A Portable Fire Extinguisher?

A portable fire extinguisher is a first aid emergency device for the extinguishment of a small and confined fire. It is at this small, confined stage, that a portable extinguisher is most effective and should be used. Many fires, promptly discovered in the incipient stage may be successfully extinguished, preventing serious damage and high dollar losses.

Portable Fire Extinguisher Training

Portable fire extinguishers are only as effective as the operators using them. It pays to train frequently and thoroughly, preferably with hands-on fire extinguishment scenarios in a controlled environment under the guidance of trained professionals.

Halton Hills Fire Department offers and encourages these training presentations to all in-
