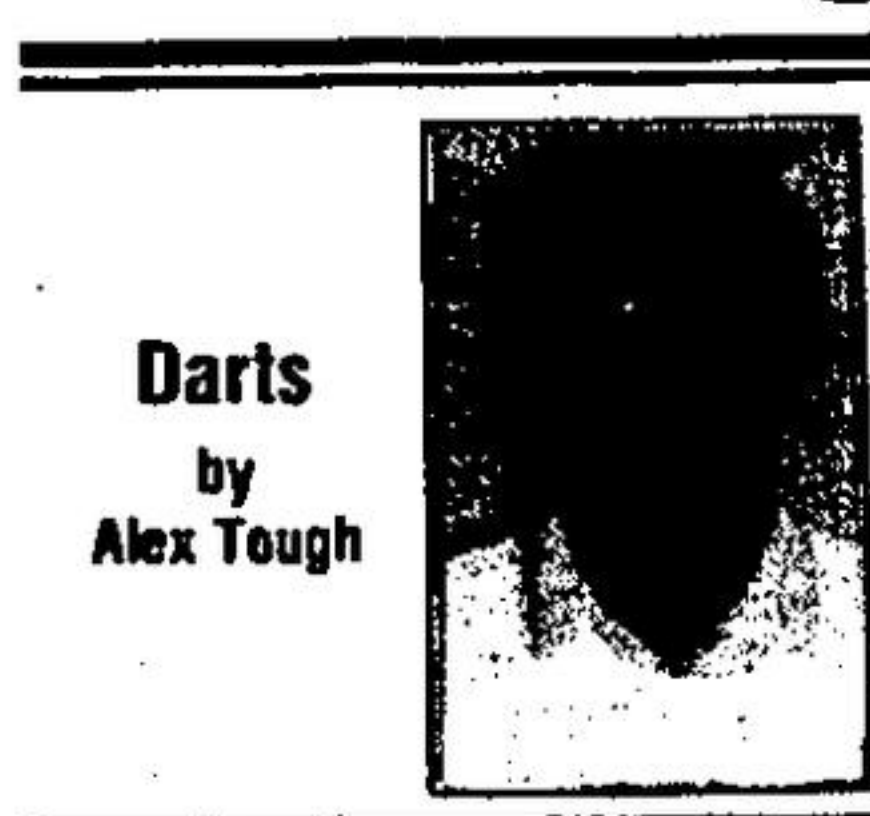
McGibbon win over George no. 1.
