Georgetown Bodanis Bruins eliminated by Milton Peeewe

Milton ended Georgetown Bodanis Bruins' hopes of advancing further on in the Ontario Minor Hockey Association playdowns by defeating the local club 3-2 at Alcott arena last Sunday.

The game terminated a closely contested series that gave local fans a taste of close, well-played hockey. All four games saw the margin of victory a single goal.

There were two ten-minute overtime games in the best of five series. The final game saw Georgetown eliminated on a Milton goal that was scored with one second remaining in regulation time.

Georgetown opened the scoring midway through the first period when Scott Lahey tipped in a shot from defenceman Kevin Lumb. David Boere also assisted on the play. Milton tied the score late in the second period and gained a 2-1 lead at the ten minute mark of the third period. David Boere made the score 2-2 on a goal

assisted by Wes Burke.

After being eliminated by Milton in the playdowns, Georgetown then travelled to Streetsville on the following Saturday to begin Tri-county championship playdowns. The game with Streetsville was closely matched and saw the Bodanis Bruins emerge victorious 6-5.

Georgetown jumped to an early 3-0 lead as they dominated early first period action. David Boere scored Georgetown's first goal, assisted by Scott Lahey. Shortly afterwards, David Kotsos put the Bruins ahead 2-0 on a goal assisted by Gary McNeily.

Two minutes later, Scott Lahey gave Georgetown a 3-0 lead on a play set up by Wes Burke and defenceman Fraser Thom. With only two minutes remaining in the period, Streetsville stormed back and scored two quick goals to end the period trailing 3-2.

The second period saw both Georgetown and Streetsville

score two goals apiece. Gary McLean scored for Georgetown on a play set up in the Georgetown end zone and assisted by Brad Spears. Georgetown's second goal of the period was scored by Scott Lahey assisted by David Boere.

Leading 5-4 entering into the third period, Georgetown went ahead 6-4 on an unassisted goal by Gary McLean at the fourteen minute mark of the period. Two minutes later Streetsville narrowed the Bodanis Bruin lead to 6-5 but were unable to tie the game as Georgetown tightened up its checking.

Georgetown's next opponent in the Tri-county playdowns is Ancaster.

Two Georgetown students help Selects take gold

Two Georgetown District High School students, Kelly Cotton and Holly Sones, helped their Peel Selects junior volleyball team go undefeated in a tournament on the weekend, their fourth gold medal finish in two months.

At Mayfield High School in Brampton on Saturday, Selects finished atop their pool, which included Waterloo Tigers, University of Toronto and Hamilton Seekers.

In the semi-final, the Peel team defeated Titans 15-3, 15-10 and took the gold with a 15-10, 15-9 win over Waterloo Tigers.

One of the major problems for Selects has been in finding competition to improve their skills. There are five provincial team members on the team and four of

those players attended the national team camp in Regina over the Christmas break. One member, Lisa Dockery, was signed with the Canadian team for this September.

Peel Selects are not eligible for high school tournaments in the United States because they are considered college players due to the fact that U.S. schools only go to grade 12 and the majority of Selects are grade 13 students.

In order to prepare for the upcoming provincial championships at Mayfield on April 6, and possibly the nationals in Winnipeg on May 1, the team is planning to travel to the University of Buffalo, Ohio State and Pittsburgh University for exhibition games in March.
