Major Novice Lumbermen win opener of Tri-County playoffs

Georgetown AA Major Novice Beaver Lumber team skated to a 3-2 victory over Brampton Maroons on Feb. 28 at Memorial Arena in the first game of the Tri County Playoffs.

The series will see Georgetown play six games in a round robin format with Brampton, Flamboro, Oakville and Chinguacousy providing the opposition.

The first period was highlighted by Ryan Bobor's goal at the 7:33 mark, assisted by Trevor Cash. Jay Campbell forced the Brampton goaltender to make a good stop at the 4:13 mark.

Scott Ellis made the score 2-0 for Georgetown, converting a pass out from behind the net by Matt Hotham. Tyler Pearce played solid goal to bring the period to an end 2-0.

Brampton scored on a deflected shot from behind the Georgetown net off McClung's skate.

Ryan Carter made a blocker save to bring to period to a close 2-1 in Georgetown's favor.

Matt Hotham gave Georgetown a 3-1 lead at the 8:42 mark with a

goal from behind the net. Brampton scored an open net goal at the 2:24 mark to add excitement to the final two minutes of the game. Final score was Georgetown 3, Brampton 2.

Lumbermen split two games in the 36th Annual Timmy Tyke Hockey Tournament at the North York Centennial Center March 2-3.

Lumbermen won the first game 3-0 against Willowdale Black Hawks. After a scoreless first period, Trevor Cash broke the ice for the Lumbermen with an unassisted goal right off the faceoff at the 2:16 mark of the second period.

Dan Smith added the second goal at the 4:43 mark with a tip in at the crease on a rebound from Brent McClung's shot.

Ryan Bobor closed out the scoring at the 5:23 mark of the second period with an end to end rush that culminated in a backhand shot which found the mark.

The second game saw the Lumbermen fall to defeat 3-1 to the Scarborough Malvern Mothers Pizza team and were eliminated from the tourney.

Atom House League

Tim Horton's completes season undefeated

Tim Horton's Atom House League finished the regular season with 14 wins and two ties, to amass 30 of a possible 32 points.

The team also won three straight games in the House League tournament in January. During the course of the season Horton's scored 84 times, while giving up only 15 goals in 16 games.

Head coach Scott Van De Valk's team emphasized effective defense, with quick transitions to a potent attack.

Horton's was supported by two strong goalies, Dylan Le and Mark Quaglia, who were also effective when playing out. Quaglia blocked countless opposition rushes on defense, while Lee contributed 13 points in the six

games he played as a forward. While the defenceman efficiently smothered opposition attacks, they also set up numerous goals from the point.

Offensively, Horton's were led by Josh Malinosky, a big centre with the ability to dominate a game. Malinosky led the league in scoring with 30 goals and 14 assists for 44 points.

Wingers John Howell with 10 goals and 17 assists and Freddy Roffel with 9 goals and 8 assists were also big offensive threats. The other forwards, Andrew Boyce, Bryan Foster and Peter Finlay were also dangerous attackers.

For five of the players on the team, Howell, Deeley, Noonan, Cartwright and Lee, the undefeated season was par-

ticularly sweet, as they played together on last season's Young's Pharmacy Novice team (also coached by Van De Valk), which also went undefeated for the season and then the playoffs.

For goalie Lee this makes three seasons in a row without a loss since he played for the Novice champion M and M Pro Sports in 88-89. Having played behind three excellent defensive teams, he now has a career record of 39 wins, 5 ties, 0 losses and 15 shutouts.

Much of the reason for Horton's success is credited to a hard-working group of young coaches, Van De Valk, Bob Dezeuw, Craig Lahey and Jim English, whose enthusiasm for hockey and commitment to games and numerous practices has helped

develop the team.

Horton's hopes to keep winning all the way to the Day of Champions April 6, but the team knows it will be tough, with five other good teams all trying to knock them off.
