CVCA concerned about watershed sediment pollution

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority is concerned about sediment pollution from construction sites within the watershed and has planned to make it part of their 1991 campaign on water quality in the Credit River.

At a meeting of the Full Authority last week, members were shown a video highlighting the watershed-wide problem and supported a move to tackle the problem.

"Sediment is quite simply dirt running off exposed land oftencarrying pollutants directly into the river," says Community Relations spokesperson Robert Peace.

Sediment is a significant water

quality issue having a serious effect on aquatic habitat. Sediment and its associated pollutants can affect fish directly and can destroy food sources for fish, Sediment deposition on the channel bottom also destroys fish spawning habitats. In addition to the biological effects the deposition of sediment can lead to increased flooding and erosion.

"Improving the control of sediment on the Credit River will require a coordinated effort on the part of the Authority, municipalities, provincial agencies and developers. The Authority does not have the legislative power to enforce sediment control standards on its own," says
