## Technology council requested

The Ministry of Health/Ontario Medical Association Task Force on the Use and Provision of Medical Services has called for the creation of a Technology Assessment Council and a guidelines committee to develop effective approaches to the provision of care and use of resources within the health care system.

In commenting on the Task Force's 1989-90 annual report, chairman Graham Scott said: "The challenge faced by both government and the medical profession is to develop quality assurance and resource management approaches to medical services. The establishment of a technology assessment council and a guidelines committee will help put health care services delivery on a more effective and efficient footing for the next century."

Specifically, the annual report recommends:

- creation of a guidelines committee to develop approaches to treatment and care;
- development of an Ontario Council on Health Technology Assessment;
- economic impact modelling for new or expanded programs funded by government; and
- careful assessment of public screening programs.

Current research activities include:

- developing a practical implementation program for cholesterol testing in a health service organization;
- assessing thyroid function tests in laboratories; and
- studying trends in the use of hospital services over the past 10 years.

The Task Force was formed in February 1988 to conduct research into medical services delivery in Ontario. Four representatives from each of the Ministry and the OMA meet regularly to sponsor selected research projects and make ongoing policy and program recommendations.
