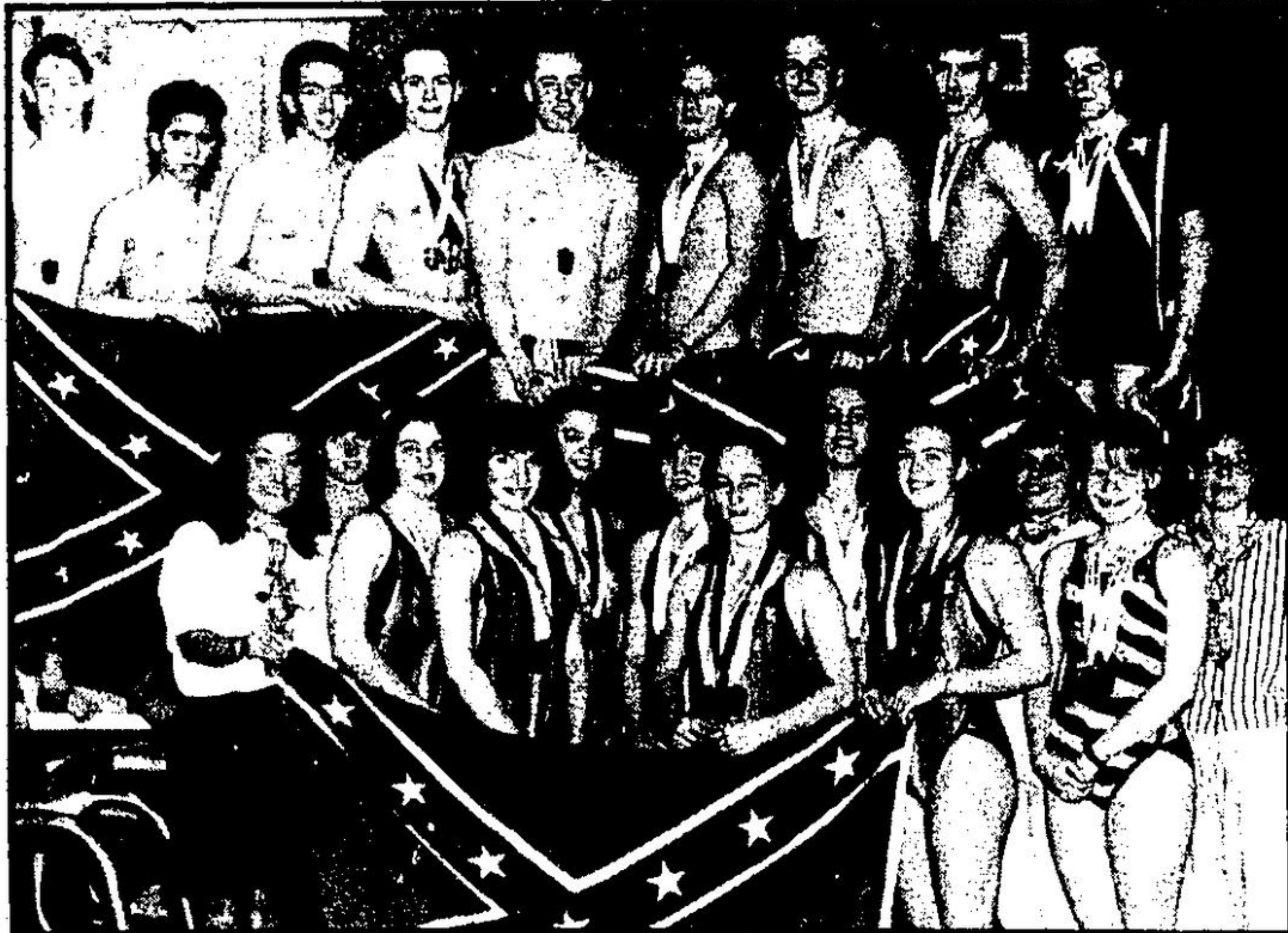

Elimination looms after Sabres lose

 Acton Sabres have their backs to the wall in the Mid-Ontario Jr. C playoffs against Orangeville Crushers, having lost 7-3 in Orangeville Tuesday and trailing the best of seven series 3-0. Tuesday's game wasn't a penalty-free affair either, featuring over 250 minutes of penalty box occupation. Several fights

took place, including one which sent Sabre's Ed Koeph to Dufferin Area Hospital to put nine stitches in his head.

Koeph received the wound when he was brought to the ice by an Orangeville player during a scuffle. According to Sabre coach Ken Steen, most of the rough stuff began after Crusher's Trevor Mugridge "ran over" goalie Jim Mantione from behind.

"It was a cheap shot. I thought we were playing them (Crushers) well until we started taking penalties," re-emphasizing that he had predicted before the beginning of the series that Sabres had to stay out of the penalty box in order to keep pace.

To illustrate Steen's point, Crushers scored four powerplay goals, the margin of victory in that match. Sabres scored one, along with a shorthanded marker late in the game.

Orangeville had taken a 2-0 lead before Jim English got on the board at 3:29 of the second period, assisted by John Van Dam.

English got his second goal at 11:31 of the middle frame, sandwiching Sabres' powerplay marker between two Crushers' own penalty advantages.

The home team completed the second period with another goal, taking a 5-2 lead into the dressing room. The shorthanded conversion by Tim McDonald wasn't enough as two more Crusher powerplay attempts were successful, earning them the victory.

Keoph is reported to be on his feet, but is a questionable start for tonight's 8:00 p.m. start at Acton. Goalie Greg Powell, who came in after Mantione's game misconduct on Tuesday, will be starting in net.
