ecute the following checklist to ensure their home is fire safe.

Always use proper fuses in your fuse panel - use 15 amp fuses for all lighting circuits.

Do not use extension cords as permanent wiring.

Electrical boxes and switches should have proper covers.

All wiring must be properly fastened.

Too many appliances in one outlet will cause overheating.

Make sure electrical cords do not go under carpets, rugs or other items that could trap heat or damage the cord.
