Acton food bank looking for logo

Now that Acton Food Share, the community's foodbank, is officially a registered charity, it has decided to create a foodbank logo that best exemplifies the type of service the organization provides to Acton residents, says Foodshare Treasurer Pat Bonozew.

To find that perfect logo, Halton Hills children and adults are invited to submit logos to the Acton Food Share logo contest. Ms. Bonozew said there will be a logo winner for adults and one for children.

Logo submissions should be sent and received by the Acton Food Share Committee no later than May 3. The winners will be declared May 11 at the Acton Arena during the Optimist Bike Rodeo at approximately 1 p.m.

Logo ideas should be sent to Acton Food Share, P.O. Box 120, Ac-

ton, L7J 2M2 and included should be the entrants' name, address, postal code and telephone number, said Ms. Bonozew.

The children's logo contest winner will be presented with a fish bowl donated by Leathertown Feed Supply while the adult contest winner will walk away with a flower arrangement set in a ceramic container donated by Blue Springs Flower Shop.

A Food Share sponsored raffle will also be held on May 11 at the Acton Arena. Prizes include one large handmade afghan, one small handmade afghan and dinner for two at the Meeting Place in Acton, said Ms. Bonozew.

People will also be able to donate food during the festivities. There will be barrels set up in the arena in which food can be dropped off.
