# Minor Pee wee Halton advances

On March 5 the Halton Minor Pee wees began and won their best of three series against Oakville Rangers.

Coming off an early exit from the Ontario Minor Hockey Association playdowns a week earlier, Hurricanes had to dig deep in this match to remain contenders for the league championships.

The series opener at Georgetown's Alcott Arena on Tuesday evening was a see-saw affair with Halton taking the lead in both the first and second periods, only to see Oakville come back twice and carry a 5-4 edge into the third.

Fortunately for Hurricanes, centre Justin Davis found his scoring touch, striking in the third and again in overtime for a 6-5 victory and a leg up in the series.

Halton's Doug Janjevich opened the scoring in this game with a power play goal at 6:56 of the first from Davis and Todd Miller.

Oakville came back with two goals to take the lead, which held up until Andrew Hartholt combined with Janjevich and Jamie Briggs with 40 seconds remaining to tie the game at two.

At 7:43 of the second, Tom Baynton's goal, set up by Miller, put Halton up 3-2 and just 24 seconds later, Jamie Walker scored on a solo effort to make it 4-2.

Oakville replied three times

before the period ended and were up 5-4 going into the final frame.

Davis took over from there, popping the first of two unassisted markers at 11:29 of the third to tie the game at five and again at 4:52 of overtime for the 6-5 win.

Game two moved to Oakville's Maplegrove Arena on Wednesday. The script was simple. Rangers had to win or their season was over.

By the end of the second period Halton held a 2-1 lead.

Solid goaltending from Halton's Jeff Langille and sound defensive play from his teammates turned Oakville's concerns into reality as the blue lights nursed their one goal cushion all the way to the buzzer.

As on Tuesday, Halton opened the scoring in this one. With just 26 seconds gone in the game, Jamie Briggs took a short pass from Steven Roy and turned it into an end to end rush and a one goal lead.

The single held up until 4:40 of the second when Oakville capitalized on a Hurricane turnover to tie things up at one each.

Halton responded at 1:10 of the period with Darin Finlayson's goal, set up by Justin Davis and John Atley. This one turned out to be the winner, giving Halton a two-game sweep of the series and a berth in the semi-finals against Brampton, who upset Barrie in the other quarter-final series.
