The Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department is introducing a local resident who will be running many of its new spring programs for this year, most of them geared towards children.

Nora Savage, who lives just outside of Acton, has been involved with children's programs for several years and is currently the secretary for the Ontario Puppetry Association and a member of Visual Arts Ontario.

Savage said she had approached the recreation department for a letter of reference when applying for a provincial grant to run her puppetry workshops when the Halton Hills staff decided to put her valuable resources to work for them.

"I thought it was a great idea. I love working with children and running the programs is easier because everything is nearby."

Puppets aren't the only thing Savage will be doing for the local recreation department. She is also involved with the Saturday morning Peanut Club and Kids in the Kitchen. The Peanut Club is comprised of games, stories, songs, crafts, puppets and other fun. The kitchen program is a cooking class that will teach eight to 12-year-olds how to put together a complete meal.

"I'll also be teaching a course in basic kite making for families. I got the idea when I was travell-

ing in Bangkok where I saw many people taking part in family kite flying days."

Savage said step by step instructions for building the kites will be given, with several different levels provided according to age level. The workshop is a half day in length and will be held May 5 at Cedarvale Park in the morning and at Prospect Park in the afternoon.

"I'm also looking forward to the Walk, Talk and Be Happy program, since it gives people of all ages the chance to do something together. It's a leisurely hike along the Bruce Trail, taking about an hour."

Savage said many groups have such walks in the summer, but are usually geared to a specific age group. The recreation department's walks will enable children, parents, young couples and seniors the opportunity to share an experience. The two dates for the walks are June 5 and June 19.

Currently, Savage is involved in teaching young children how to make pop-up books at the Georgetown Library on Saturdays. After the spring programs are completed, Savage said she will be offering a puppet workshop in the fall for adults interested in learning how to make them.
