Ms. Bell-Smith has left the hectic pace of life in Ontario and is returning to her home in Dalhousie, New Brunswick.

Vanessa had been employed with the Open Door for two years prior to her resignation and she became an important part of our community.

Along with working as Director in the two programs, Vanessa also did family councilling, planning and organizing of fundraising events, and she made herself available to anyone in need 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

During the short time that I knew Ms. Bell-Smith, I saw her give up her privacy and independence so that a youth could have a place to stay and also help others establish themselves and sort out their feelings and frustrations.

In this confusing and complicated world that we live in, we need more people like Vanessa.

At a small gathering held in Vanessa's honor, Dave Presswood, an Open Door native, described his first impressions of Bell-Smith, "When Vanessa first came to the Open Door, I thought that here comes another Open Door person, but Vanessa was more. She not only wanted to be with us, she wanted to be a part of . us." This is definitely what happened.

Vanessa saw this group through weddings, raltionships and break-ups, through birth and pregnancy to convictions and jail sentences. From drug and alcohol abuse and addiction to rehabilitation. Most importantly from loneliness to friendship and love.

As a small token of appreciation for all that, Vanessa was : presented with a jewellery case from the Open Door, a watch and collage of photographs from the Young Mothers; toiletries from Sarah Selhi and Steve Holmes; a bottle of wine from O'Tooles


