

Senior bowlers prepare for tournaments

March 28 and April 4 are the qualifying dates for the Senior Invitational. The top six boys and four girls will be divided up and put on to two teams that will be coached by Ralph Miller and Dee Dee Haynes.

Despite the fact that other houses are putting in all men and women teams, Georgetown will

be using a mixed team format for this tournament. There is a social for both teams to attend after the tournament.

Also on April 4, the Seniors will be qualifying for the Combo tournament. This pins-over-average tournament will be held in-house on April 14. The top male and female bantam-junior-senior team will move on to the Zone Round later in April. The coaches for this tournament are yet to be announced.

April 21 will be a busy day for the seniors as there are two dif-

Dart season's end brings excitement

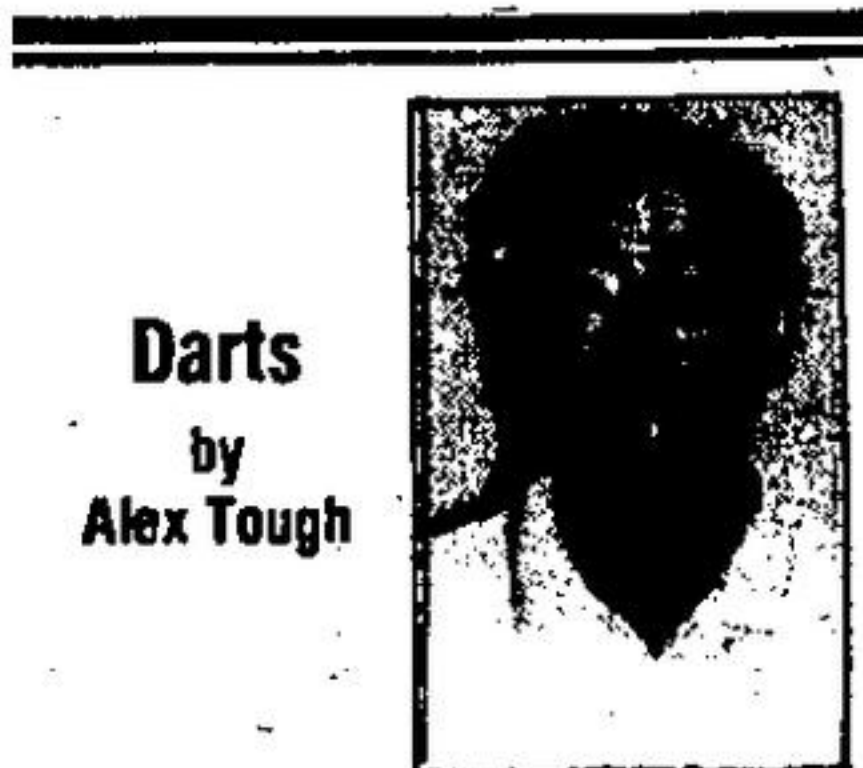

The Industrial League first and second division champions were also decided last Wednesday. First division leaders, Snowjacks Hustlers, clinched the title with a 5-4 win over runners-up, Gasketman Cutters. Third place goes to Westenders who lost to High Rollers by 4-5.

Second division champs are Acadian Pools who defeated Inter County 6-3. Inter County have been caught by Aces with their 8-1 win over Independents. This last night of league play will decide the second place between Aces and Inter County. The other matter of interest will be to see if Bandits can win for the first time - or go through the season without a win.
