According to the "Encyclopedia of The Musical Theatre," the Broadway production of "Forum" premiered in 1962. The music and lyrics are by Stephen Sondheim, based on the book by Burt Shevelove and Larry Gelbart.

The authors researched the 21 surviving plays by the Roman playwright Plautus and came up with a play incorporating characters and situations they found in them.

The result was a "bawdy, farcical musical full of sight gags, pratfalls, mistaken identity and other familiar vaudeville ingredients."

The show centres around con-ning servants, a lascivious master, a domineering mistress, a naive hero, a self-centred warrior and of course a beautiful young heroine. Gather your friends and celebrate the arrival of spring with a fun-filled evening of musical comedy ... see you at the Forum.

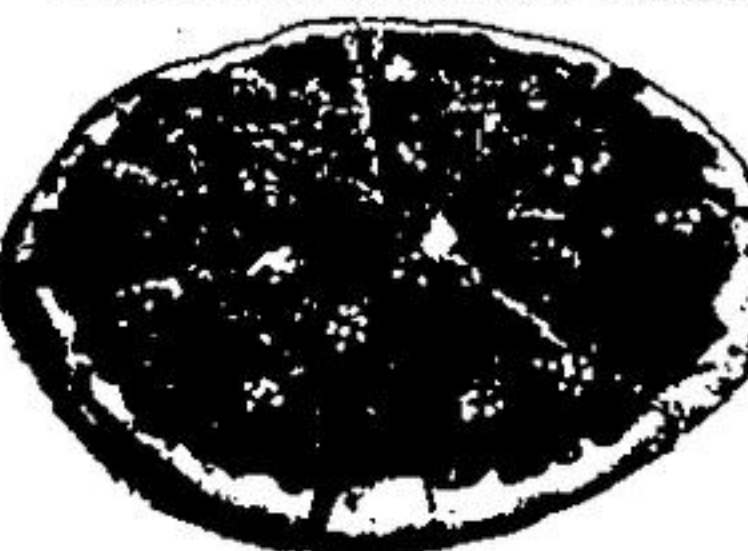
