"Job-hunters should be wary of advertisements offering positions in distanct locations or foreign countries," says Marilyn Gurevsky of the Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations.

"Ads promising large, quick profits through work-at-home plans should also be suspect," she says. "And if a prospective employer asks for money, a warning bell should sound in the job-



hunter's mind." Often these schemes-sound like great opportunities. But many are scams providing jobs and money only for the scam artists.

When times are good, the ministry's Consumer Services Bureau report only one or two phone calls per month from people who've lost money in employment scams. But with the jobless rate on the rise, dishonest promoters are making big profits by taking advantage of the increasing number of people looking for work. Consumer agencies are now receiving hundreds of calls about fake employment schemes.

"Our tracking shows the current situation is as bad as it has been since the last recession," Gurevsky warns. "And techniques now used to deceive the public are more sophisticated than they were in the early 1980s."







