Corvettes were small ships, approximately 200 feet long, by 33 feet at their widest point. Although very seaworthy, they were "lively" ships, and heaved and pitched through the North Atlantic gales like corks in a washing machine. Intended for a crew of about sixty the addition of new pieces of equipment e entually pushed the size of the crew to nearly a hundred. There were no bunks, and off-duty crewmen slung their hammocks above the mess tables. No one bathed for the two to three weeks it took to zig-zag across from St. John's to Londonderry, and every man's

clothes were usually soaked through when he came off watch. But corvettes could turn on a dime, faster and tighter than the U-boats they hunted, and they were the backbone of the Battle of the Atlantic.






