Hydro to hire workers

Halton Hills Hydro Commission directed staff Friday to hire four part-time workers to be employed this summer.

Three of the part-time employees will be used to cut lawns at the utility's substation locations and fill in for office staff.

Each will be paid \$8.50 per hour. A university engineering student will also be hired to do computer work for the commission and will be paid \$10.00 per hour.

Initially, the jobs were to be offered only to students. But based on the recession and the experience the Town of Halton Hills has experienced to date regarding temporary workers, the commission decided to offer the jobs to anyone.

Town of Halton Hills Mayor and Hydro Commissioner, Russ Miller, said Friday the Town received 246 applications for four temporary Town Recreation and Parks positions. The positions pay \$12.03 per hour and run from the beginning of April to the end of September.

Town Superintendent for Parks
Bryan Shynall Monday confirmed the Mayor's information and
added that there was only 30 applications for the same positions
last year. He attributed the
drastic increase to the recession.

Hydro freebie

Halton Hills Hydro Commission wants Town residents with utility rental water heaters to take advantage of the free water heater blankets and water pipe cover the commission is now offering.

The water heater blankets and hot water covers lengthen the time it takes for water to become cold. In turn, people using these accessories will use less hot water, said Commission General Manager Gerry Trudell Friday.

Included in the package is an energy efficient shower head, said Mr. Trudell.

Despite the available savings, Mr. Trudell said few residents have responded to the offer since the utility began advertising in the local newspapers three weeks ago.

To drum up interest the commission will be telephoning townspeople using a rental hot water heater to tell them about the offer, said Mr. Trudell.

Those who own their own hot water heater are able to purchase the blanket and cover for \$18. The energy efficient water head will be offered free of charge.


The Association is forced to hire ambulance drivers during the summer, said Mr. Bonnette,


The Chairman said the association is still waiting for the \$6,000 in provincial funding North-Halton MPP Noel Duignan promised last fall.
