Lost control

Halton Regional Police report a Georgetown man severely damaged his 1974 Horizon after he lost control of it and rolled it over on Fall Brook Trail north of 9th Line Saturday afternoon. Police say the man went around a curve, struck the side of an embankment, spun around, struck the embankment again with the rear of his vehicle and rolled it over. The car came to rest on the roof. The driver survived uninjured and two passengers in the vehicle sustained minimal injuries, police say. No charges have been laid.

Impaired driving

Police charged a Terra Cotta man with impaired driving after he demolished his car in a one-vehicle accident Friday evening on 17 Sideroad east of 10th Line. Police say the man lost control of his 1990 Pontiac Sunbird couple and rolled the vehicle over. He received only minimal injuries.

Break-and-enters

Police suspect the same persons are responsible for three break and enters on Guelph Street in Georgetown overnight Thursday. One of the break-ins occurred at Colour Your World on Guelph Street where unknown persons pried open a rear door, sorted through a filing cabinet, desk and cash drawer stealing the float money in the drawer. Wendy's Restaurant was another establishment broken into that night. There, unknown suspects used a crow bar to gain entry into the building and then into an office where they attempted to open a safe. They were unsuccessful but broke the safe handle off in the process say police causing \$500 damage to the safe. The third break and enter occurred at Crossway Donuts on Guelph Street where an amount of cash and cigarettes were taken. Police are continuing to investigate the break-and-enters.

Mischief charge

A Wingham man has been charged with mischief under \$1,000 after the front door of O'Toole's in Georgetown was snapped off its hinges during a dispute Sunday night. Police say an employee at the roadhouse cut the Wingham man off from drinking and asked him to leave. Upon exiting, the man snapped the door off so the employee called the police who arrested the man a short distance away. The 42-year-old man will appear in Milton court May 27.

Drug store entered

Police report approximately nine bottles of an anti-diarrhea medication were stolen from Glenlea Drug Mart in Acton Saturday night. Police say unknown suspects entered the business by shattering a front door pane of glass and removed the anti-diarrhea medication, one bottle of antibiotics and two bottles of cough syrup. The anti-diarrhea medication contains a "very mild dosage of powdered opium" police were told by the store owner. Total losses are estimated at \$43.25. Police are continuing the investigation.

Cars vandalized

Police report six cars had their tires slashed overnight Saturday while parked in Georgetown. Two vehicles on Weber Drive had tires slashed and others were vandalized on Sargent Road, MacKenzie Drive and Mountainview Road South. Total damage to the cars is estimated at \$2,040. In all, 10 tires were slashed, possibly with a screwdriver, say police, who are continuing to investigate.

Railroad signals damaged

All railroad signals between Malton and Burlington, including all of Georgetown, weren't operating for an unknown time period Saturday night after culprits damaged four circuit panels located near the tracks just west of Mountainview Road say police. The damage to the computerized circuit panel is estimated at \$3,000. It was a CN rail circuit panel. Police are investigating.

Meat stolen

One thousand dollars worth of deli meats were stolen Friday night from a Georgetown Deli shop on Guelph Street. Police say unknown suspects entered the establishment by prying open a door with a crow bar and once inside, removed various meats along with an amount of rolled coins. Police are continuing to investigate.

Street signs broken

Police charged an Acton man with mischief under \$1,000 after he broke a \$350 street sign for Mill Street and Young street in Acton Thursday night. Police say the man was in a highly intoxicated state. He will appear in Milton court May 27.

Careless driving

An 18-year-old Acton man has been charged with careless driving after he hit three pedestrians. Police say the man, driving a 1979 Ford, pulled from the northbound lane of Churchill Road south into the southbound lane behind three walking pedestrians. He slowed down almost to a stop and bumped into them. One pedestrian got up on the hood of the vehicle and the driver accelerated, causing the person to fall off and injure her wrists. She sustained minor injuries.

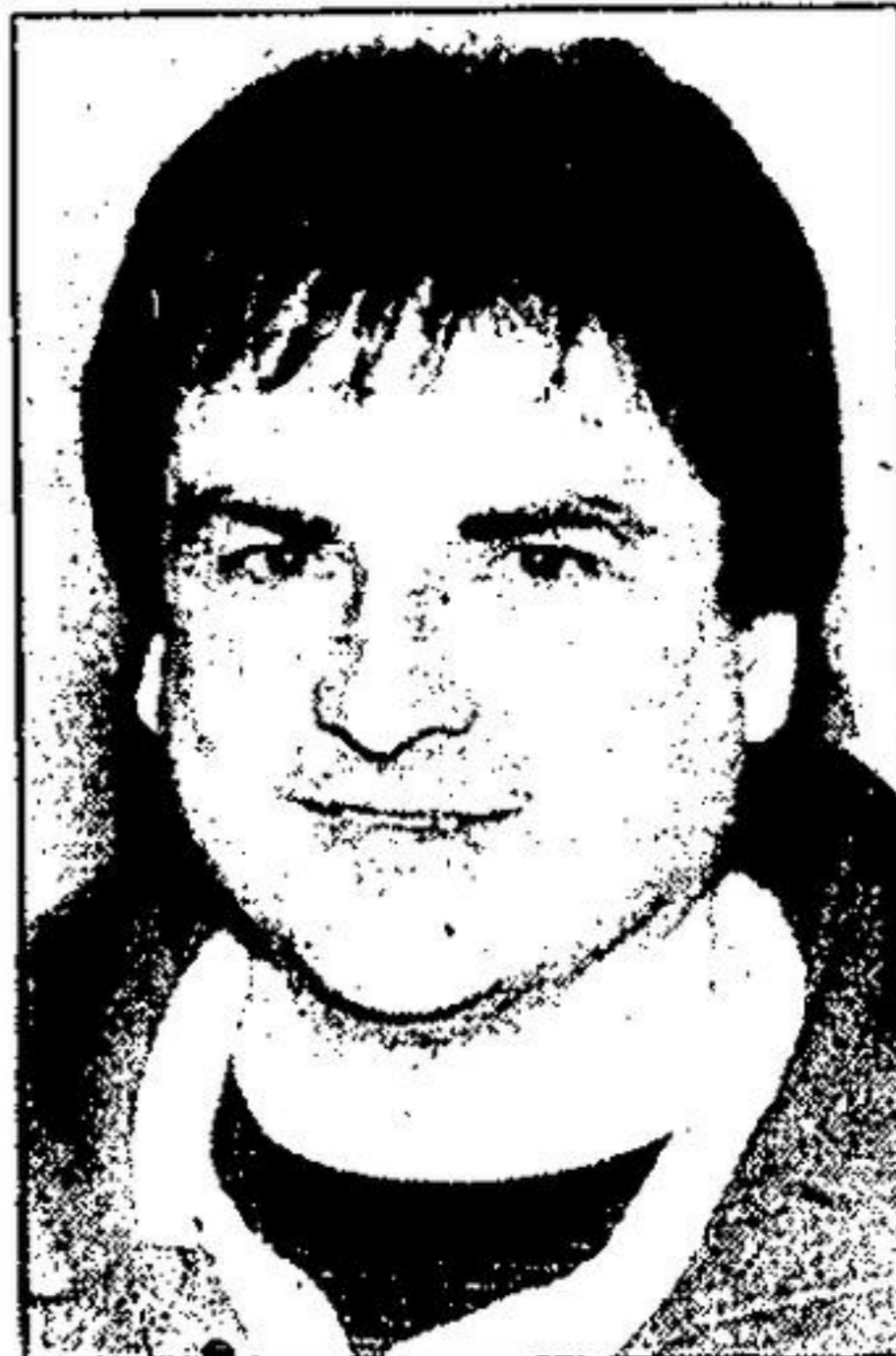
Are you concerned with national unity?
