Turner phone-in program possible regular event

The Phone-in television program hosted by Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner last Thursday on Halton Cable, was not without problems, but it was successful enough to warrant holding it on a regular basis, said Mr. Turner.

Also participating on the program were "A Talk With Garth Turner" were Halton Hills Herald reporter Ben Dummett and former Georgetown Independent/Acton Free Press Managing Editor Hartley Coles.

Mr. Turner came up with the idea to reach a larger segment of local residents. In the past, he has run Town Hall meetings to reach the constituency. The problem with this format, explained Mr. Turner, is that people are not always able to leave their residences to attend the meetings.

Mr. Turner said he will try to host similar programs on a more regular basis to supplement the Town Hall meetings. Ideally, he would like to do the programs monthly but that depends on there being available air time and his own schedule.

The only negative aspect of the evening was that the phones failed to work for the first 20 minutes. "But once the technical difficulties were ironed out, things ran smoothly," he said.

There approximately 20 phone calls during the hour-long show, most of which centred on the economy, the Quebec question and immigration.

Mr. Turner predicted there would have been more calls had the phone system not gone on the blink.

He wasn't surprised at any of the questions saying he was fully prepared for anything and

everything. "Any topic was open," said Mr. Turner. Summarizing the evening, Mr.

Turner said the volunteers behind the camera made the show the success it was.
