Halton Region Museum Planning Exibit on **Infectious Diseases**

On Sunday, May 19, from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m., the Halton Region Museum invites visitors to an Open House to view two new exhibits. Plague to AIDS: Lessons Our Past, and AIDS: Halton's Response examine society's response to infectious disease, from the bubonic plague during the Middle Ages up to the present struggle with the disease commonly known as AIDS. The Plague to AIDS exhibit is on loan from the Museum of the History of Medicine in Toronto. The exhibit entitled AIDS: Halton's Response, is produced by the Halton Region Museum. The exhibits will be on display until October 14th.


In the past, infectious diseases were thought to be transmitted by had vapours, called miasmas. On: i the ways people protected then selves during times of plague was by carrying pomanders filled with aromatic herbs and spices. Typical of this approach was the use of protective masks, fashioned in the form of bird "beaks", worn by Italian and French doctors during the 17th and early 18th centuries. These masks contained aromatic substances to counteract the miasmas believed to spread

plagues. Similarly, the long robes worn by doctors were coated with an aromatic, paste to prevent penetration by the sticky vapours.

Prior of the invention of vaccines and immunization, infectious diseases generated fear and hysteria as they decimated entire communities. Reactions to these diseases included both traditional healing methods and panicdriven behaviors such as the imposition of rigid quarantines and blaming scapegoats as the cause.

Plague to AIDS: Lessons from Our Past compares social reactions to infectious diseases in the past with contemporary attitudes towards the disease known as AIDS. It also demonstrates how such reactions can be detrimental to public education about the disease. Both exhibits, including Halton's analysis of the AIDS dilemma in AIDS: Halton's Response (developed in conjunction with the Halton Regional Health Department), are designed to heighten public awareness of the complex social and medical issues surrounding this disease.






