Rates stimulating market

Lower interest rates are stimulating the real estate market. Dave Morrell, president of the Brampton Real Estate Board, reports that sales in March show an increase of 52% over the month of February and an increase of 74% over March of 1990. The sales for March indicated that most activity has been in the low to moderate price ranges. Mr. Morrell, however, also advised that there are, as of the end of March, only 159 fewer listings on the BREB's MLS computer system compared to the end of February. Sales of 822 units represented a dollar volume of \$153,946,876, an increase of \$66,485,268 over the month of February, 1991.

The reduction of prices over the past year and the more recent reduction of interest rates have made more homes available at a price and payment schedule that are attractive to first time home buyers.

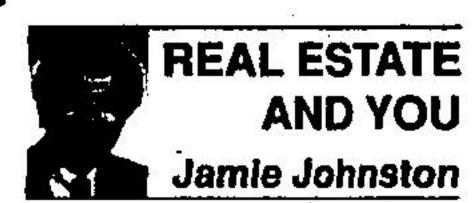
Choosing carpet

Any reputable dealer should be happy to assist you and explain the difference in qualities. The depth, thickness and density of the pile are all indicators of the quality of the carpet. Different carpets create different atmospheres. A thick pile density is quite "formal" while a shag carpet may be seen as more "casual".

Be skeptical of large promises and dealer advertisements. In carpeting, as with most commodities you generally get what you pay for. An offer to carpet two rooms at one low price suggests that the quality may be lacking.

Be sure to scrutinize the final contract. Make sure that all the specifications are present, including the manufacturer's name, the brand name, size, colour, style, underpadding, installation and finance charges.
