Bicycling helmets a safe suggestion

They're very popular! Children love to ride them; grown-ups use them for recreation and fitness. And they are a great means of transportation. We're talking about bicycles, of course. Cycling is an increasingly popular activity, and every year more than ε million bicycles are sold in Canada.

But there are other, less pleasant, statistics. More than 200 Canadians die each year as a result of cycling accidents. At least 75 percent of these tragedies are the result of head injuries, with children 5 to 14 years of age accounting for roughly half of these deaths. In addition, for children, cycling accidents are the leading cause of hospitalization for head injuries. For all age groups, most long-term disabilities resulting from cycling accidents are due to head injuries.

In recent years, helmets have been developed that offer good head protection and reduce the risk of head injuries. These cycling helmets meet one of the following standards: 'Canadian Standards Association (CSA), Snell Foundation, or American National Standards Institute (ANSI).

Although children form the group most at risk on bikes, they are least likely to wear helmets. Parents should purchase properly-fitted helmets for their children and ensure that they wear them every time they cycle. And parents should set a good example for their children and always wear a helmet when cycl-
