· Mailbox blown up

Halton Regional Police say a brass mailbox flew 50 feet in the air after unknown suspects placed a firecracker in it Sunday night. Police report the victim, who lives on Greystone Crescent in Georgetown was awakened by a large bang which was his mailbox exploding into pieces. One of the pieces struck his car, scratching the drivers side door. Damage is estimated at \$450. Police are continuing their investigation.

Caught in the act

A thief was caught in the act of stealing cigarettes Friday at Crossway Donuts in Georgetown, police report. An employee at the store was baking donuts in the back of the building when he heard a noise out front and saw a white male, approximately five feet 10 inches tall and weighing 170 pounds with a red bandana on his face behind the counter with

 two packages of cigarettes in his hand. The employee gave chase but couldn't catch the culprit.
 Police are continuing their investigation.

Shed damaged

Unknown culprits caused \$1,000 damage to a shed at Acton High School between May 17 and 19, police say. The culprits broke 12 wooden panels on the shed door and broke the clasp of a padlock on the side door while entering and leaving the shed. Police say nothing appears to be missing from the shed which is used to store chalk for the football field at the school.

Police report unknown culprits broke a sun porch window at a Delrex Boulevard home Sunday night by throwing a golf bag through it. Police say the suspects also three eggs at the window. Police are continuing to investigate the incident.

Hydro may lower rental fees

Local renters of hot water heaters may have lower rental fees next year based on a projected decrease in the cost to Halton Hills Hydro to install and maintain the heaters.

Halton Hills Hydro Accountant Danny Edwards told the untility's five-member commission Friday that for the first time, the first quarter of this year marked the only time in the last 20 years in which billing revenue generated for the water heaters was greater than the cost to install and maintain them.

Any profit earned from the heaters at the end of the year would mean lower rental fees next year.

Renters of water heaters pay a monthly fee to the untility and in return, the utility must install new heaters and maintain existing heaters free of charge to the customer.

The commission along with

The commission, along with commissions throughout Ontario, has been lobbying Ontario Hydro to permit commissions to increase the rental fees for water heaters to bring the fees inline

with the cost to utilities to install and maintain the heaters, said Mr. Edwards.

Finally, Ontario Hydro gave permission for the rental fees to be increased starting at the beginning of this year. As a result Halton Hills Hydro has made a \$3,433 profit from hot water heater rental fees during the first three months of 1992.


As long as several heaters don't break down all at once, said Mr. Edwards, the profit margin should increase significantly over the next six months.




Lost in smoke
