## Local duo in the limelight

You can catch a rising star at the New Duke of York Restaurant on Guelph Street this weekend, May 24 and 25.

Local talents Adam Broughton and Shane Oldreive will entertain patrons with a range of musical styles, from Frank Sinatra and Nat King Cole, to Harry Connick Jr. and a little James Taylor too.

The pair are back together after a year of music studies away from home, Shane at York University, and Adam at McGill, where he's working towards a music degree with a Certificate in Jazz Studies.

The restaurant has a special buffet menu for Friday and Saturday evenings, or you can just enjoy a drink and hors d'oeuvres as you listen, from 6:30 p.m. onward.

Shane and Adam first appeared together in the rock group Tempest, when they were students at Centennial School. That band included future NHL draftee Adam Bennett on bass.

While Bennett traded his guitar for a hockey stick, Oldreive and Broughton became active in the jazz programme at Georgetown High School. Under the direction of Mrs. Katie Kirkup-Ortolan, they competed at national music festivals across Canada, winning individual and group honors each time.

Adam has studied voice, keyboard, and drums, as well as bagpipes and violin, (which are not part of the act!) Shane plays guitar: acoustic, electric or classical, depending on the occasion. At the New Duke of York, you'll hear Adam on vocals, and Shane on guitar.

During a school trip to Europe, Adam performed in a German pub, and provided impromptu street music under the statue of Mozart in the Salzburg town square.

Although they were "pretty focussed on music" during high school, both were Ontario scholars, and Adam was Valedictorian at the Graduation ceremonies last year. Now he plays in Montreal night clubs and restaurants, and Shane performed in York area pubs this winter.

Adam laments the limited range of music on popular radio and TV. "People are being programmed - they just absorb it without thinking. They don't relate to artists, or find meaning in quality lyrics and musicianship." He listens to CBC and CJRT radio to hear other styles, and is interested in Toronto's underground musical theatre. "The Phantom is all marketing and special effects."

"To me, jazz is the most expressive, communicative form of music," says Adam. "It's very improvisational, very free and very difficult to study. To get a mastery is a lifelong pursuit."

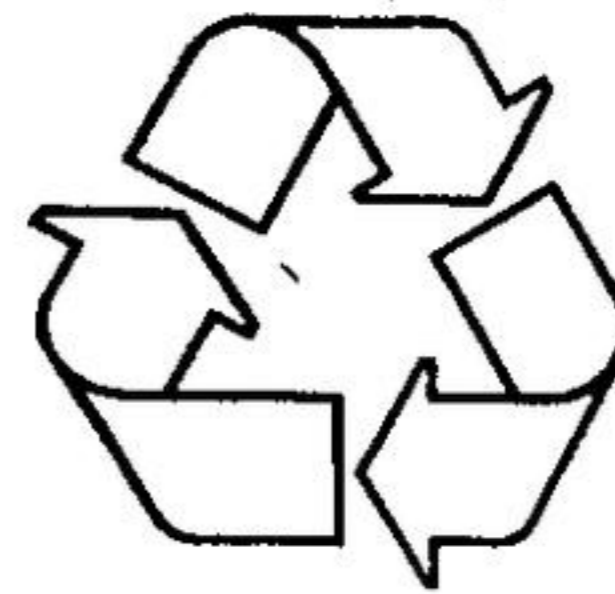
