Cystic Fibrosis success story

Last weekend got off to a great sunny start for Cystic Fibrosis with the Peel Chapter's garage sale on Heather Court raising over \$2,000.00 for C.F. There was everything on sale from masson jars and books to a 1971 Volkswagen. Garage sale organizers Julie Bisshop and Karla Hale were very pleased with the results and are already planning for next years garage sale.

Sunday, the rains came and dampened the ground but not the spirits of the over 40 participants in Moonwalk 91 sponsored by Zellers. Although this is the first time in it's six year history it has rained during the event, Zellers Manager Paul Alger was pleased



with the results and with the over \$1,250.00 in pledges raised. The family with the most pledges was the Bisshop family.

Among the new initiatives established for Moonwalk 91 was a 15% discount coupon for all participants to be used at Zellers on June 3 and 4. Also, in an effort to involve the schools, Zellers created a special support program, offering schools which have 25 students or more participating, the opportunity to win one of 20 cash prizes of \$1,000.00.
