Miss Clair McEachern, a teen soloist from Durham, Ont., gave two lovely solos entitled "Friends" and "The Lord's Prayer".

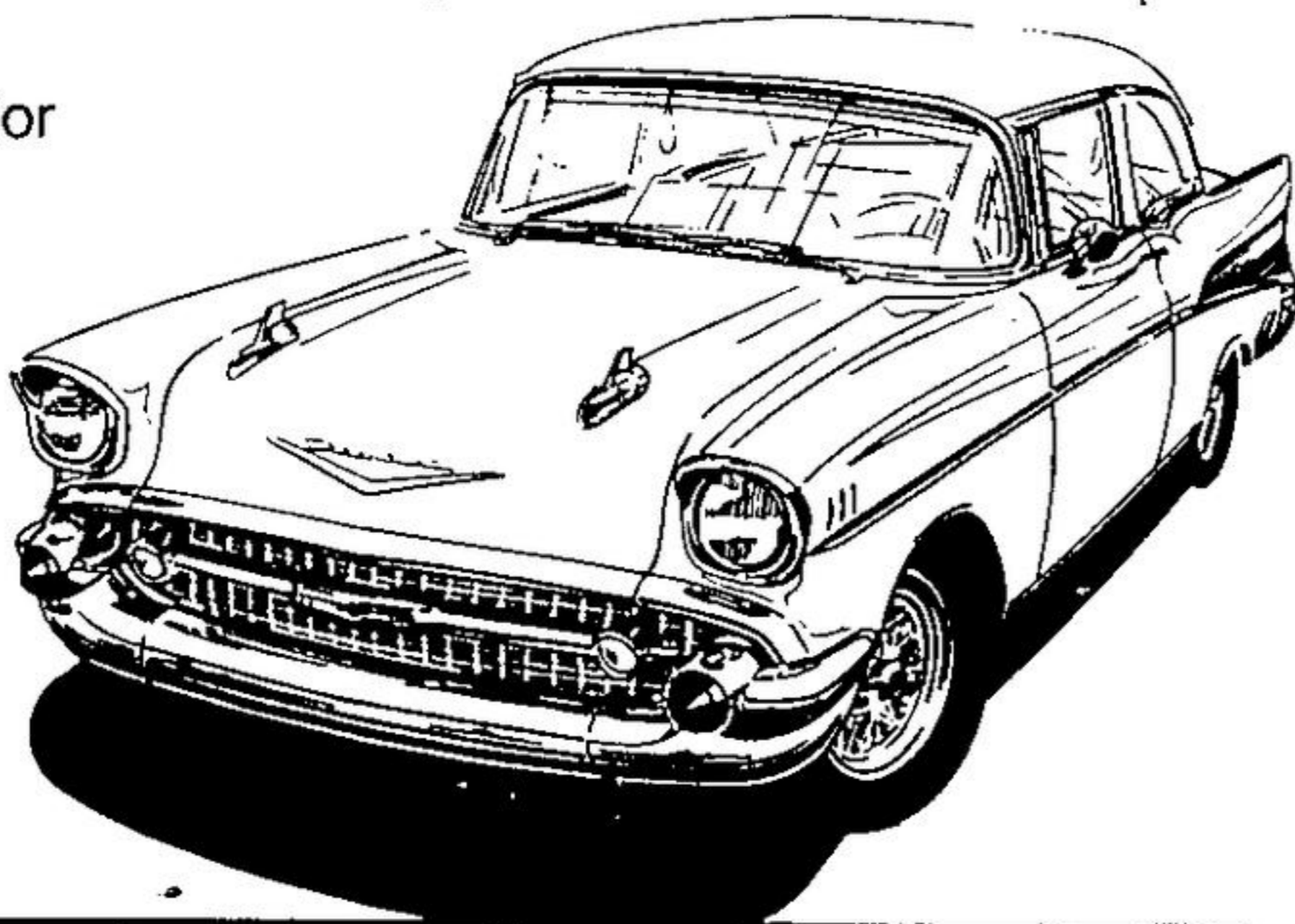
