

# Georgetown resident honored

The 27th recipient of the J.R. MacGregor Trophy and Scroll is Tom Ramautarsingh, of Georgetown.

Ken McClymont, chairman of the Ottawa and District Boys' Work Committee, made the presentation and made the following comments -

"Tonight is a unique situation when we present the J.R. MacGregor Trophy to Mr. Tom Ramautarsingh. This trophy is presented to an individual who has given years of dedicated service to the youths of this country. We can readily accept the fact that Tom Ramautarsingh qualified. Tom came to Ottawa in 1956 and met with many of the leaders in boys' and youth work, and since that time he has assisted us in our program.

Tom was president of the Trinidad Boys' Work Board for 5 years and Chairman of the Trinidad and Tobago National Youth Council. He was a delegate to the Commonwealth Youth Conference in London and the World Assembly of Youth in Berlin.

In Canada, he took his Grade 13 in Kitchener-Waterloo, completed his BA (English and History) and his MA (History) at

Wilfrid Laurier University and a Master of Education at the University of Toronto. He earned the Principals' Certificate and Guidance Specialist certificate from York University and a History Specialist certificate and teacher's certification from the University of Toronto.

He has for many years served in different capacities in areas that pertain to education and community work. I would just name a few examples. At Laurier, he served as freshman president, led a UN Model delegation to the University of Montreal, was editor of the literary magazine, member of the Board of Governors and Senate, alumni president, co-founder and first chairman of the WLU Language Arts Conference, was table tennis champion and chairman of the Seagram Stadium Gift Committee.

In Georgetown, Tom served as chairman of Georgetown High School Commencement Committee (4 years), chaired the very successful "I Love Georgetown Program, Founder and President of the Holy Cross Parents' Association, Vice chairman of the High School Centennial Commit-

tee and editor of the Centennial yearbook. He chaired and organized the Optimist Club essay contests, oratorical and art contest and Tom is a director on the Halton Hills Chamber of Commerce and served as chairman of Logo Contest, member of the Business of the Year Award and social committees.

Tom has assisted us at the Woodland Camps held at Luskville, Quebec. He has participated at the National Youth Parliament of Canada on the social committee in 1980 and as Sergeant-at-Arms in 1982 and 1984. You know that National Youth Parliament is held in the Senate Chamber on Parliament Hill in the month of August and that the young MP's come from all the provinces and territories."

The award is richly and rightly deserved as Tom has been and is a true humanitarian. He has won many awards for his hard work and dedication to the activities and to people with whom he works. He has always exhibited a very high degree of professionalism, dedication to duty and service to others. We are proud of him and we offer him our heartfelt congratulations."
