## Glen's flag football streak broken by M & M on Sunday

The Glen had its, 1991 season's unbeaten record broken by M and M on Sunday at Georgetown District High School, dropping a 21-18 decision.

M and M started out slowly, allowing The Glen to jump out to a 14-0 lead before replying with a major of its own. After a field goal by The Glen, M and M came back with a touchdown, followed by another major at the end of the game to take the win.


