

Minor Peewees back on track with win over Milton

After a very promising training camp Acmetrack Minor Peewees ran into some tough opposition from Burlington, Brampton and Oakville and started the season 0-5. On June 3, however, optimism was high for a home game against Milton.

A throwing error in the first inning led to a 3-0 Milton lead and it looked like it would be another long night. The defence tightened up however and the offence came alive.

In the bottom of the second inning, both Mike Kelly and Andrew Beavan crossed the plate on wild pitches after being walked aboard. In the third inning, Georgetown exploded for six runs with RBI singles from Steve Gibbons, Mike Kelly, Andrew Beavan and Geoff Stoneham.

The other key play in the inning was a nifty double steal by Doug Inglis and Gibbon.

With the score 8-p3 in favor of Georgetown, Milton was threatening in the top of the fourth when second baseman

Michael Crawford made a spectacular diving catch. This play seemed to take the steam out of the visitors and with three more runs in the bottom of the inning the game was well in hand for the home team.

Gibbons continued his hot streak (batting over .500 for the season) as he singled home Dan Hughson with the ninth run. After both Inglis and Beavan had singled to load the bases Crawford and Stoneham were walked to count two more runs.

In the bottom of the fifth, Gib-

bons hit a long double over the centre fielders head to bring Inglis home with run number 12.

All this time pitcher Mike Kelly had not allowed a run since the first inning and those three were unearned. In the top of the sixth however he started to tire and Milton counted four runs to get to within five. Todd Bussell got that one back however as he came home on a wild pitch. He had singled and been moved to third on two sacrifices by Crawford and Chris Kilmer.

Kelly took care of matters by

himself in the top of the final inning as he counted a strikeout and two assists to get a well deserved rest.

For his complete game, eight strikeouts, a single and two runs scored, Kelly shared Player of the Game honours with Gibbons. Steve was a one man wrecking crew as he had two singles, a double, three RBI's and two runs scored. In games previous to this one, Kevin Humeniski, Gibbons and Doug Inglis were Selected Players of the Game.

Hoosiers lose 7-6 to Brampton

Firestone Halton Hills Hoosiers Girls Bantam Softball team had its best comeback of the year go for naught as the Brampton Blazers avenged their earlier defeats to the Hoosiers with a 7-6 victory in Brampton last week. The loss evened Firestone's league record at 3-3.

After two and a half scoreless innings, Brampton capitalized on two errors and three timely hits to take a commanding 6-0 lead. Firestone began to chip away at the lead in the next inning. Michelle Soley led off with a single and advanced to third courtesy of an error and a groundout. Amy Korzak then proceeded to record the RBI with a grounder to second.

Sharon Stigger came in to pitch for Firestone and kept Brampton at bay, with the help of good defense behind her. In the fourth,

Denise Hannah caught a liner and doubled off the runner at first. In the fifth, Andrea Chapman fielded flawlessly at shortstop for all three outs.

Firestone crept a run closer in the sixth. Sherie Peacock, on base via a fielder's choice, stole second and scored on a throwing error by the Brampton catcher. In the bottom of the inning, catcher Soley threw out the runner attempting to steal second, to highlight another scoreless frame.

In the top of the seventh, the Hoosiers put together a four-run rally to tie up the game. Stigger led off and was hit by a pitch. One out later, Shannon Morris drove in Stigger with a single up the middle. Soley doubled to put runners at second and third, and Peacock followed with a two run double. It was 6-5.

Peacock proceeded to take third on a wild pitch, and Stacy Colarossi drove her in with a ground ball. The game was tied. Unfortunately for Hoosiers, a two-base throwing error allowed Brampton to score in the bottom of the inning, to take the contest 7-6.

Line totals for the game were: Brampton - seven runs on eight hits and three walks, while committing three errors and leaving five runners on base; Halton Hills - six runs on eight hits and five walks, while committing four errors and stranding seven runners. The losing pitcher was Morris, yielding three earned runs over four innings.

Firestone's next home league game is tonight (Wednesday) when they host the team from Streetsville.
