Student Manpower can help

The summer season is rapidly approaching and for students, this means searching for a summer job. Although some employers have completed their hiring, for many others, the search for summer employees is just beginning. The Canada Employment Centre for Students (CEC-S) offers free services to both students and employers. The CEC-S acts as a liaison between students looking for jobs and employers seeking students for employment in their home or business.

Students visiting the CEC-S will

be able to examine the job advertisements posted on the job board. Counselling services related to job search strategies, including looking for a job, writing a resume, and preparing for a job interview, are available upon request. Students can also enquire about various federal and provincial programs designed to assist them in their summer employment search.

Many employers find the

CEC-S to be a helpful resource during the busy summer months. The Centre advises vacant jobs to student job seekers, and CEC-S staff can screen applicants to refer only those students most qualified for the position. Homeowners requiring a student to complete an odd job, such as mowing the lawn or painting a fence, can also contact the CEC-S.

Any students interested in using the services of the CEC-S should come into the office to look over job vacancies or to ask questions about their job search. Employers are encouraged to call the office at 877-7797 or 877-7751, or drop in to the office to place a job order. June 19 is Hire A Student Day. Any employers who place a job order before this day will have their name entered in a lottery to be eligible to win one of several great prizes. The Centre is open from Monday to Friday between 8:30 and 4:30, and is located at 232 Guelph St. in Georgetown.

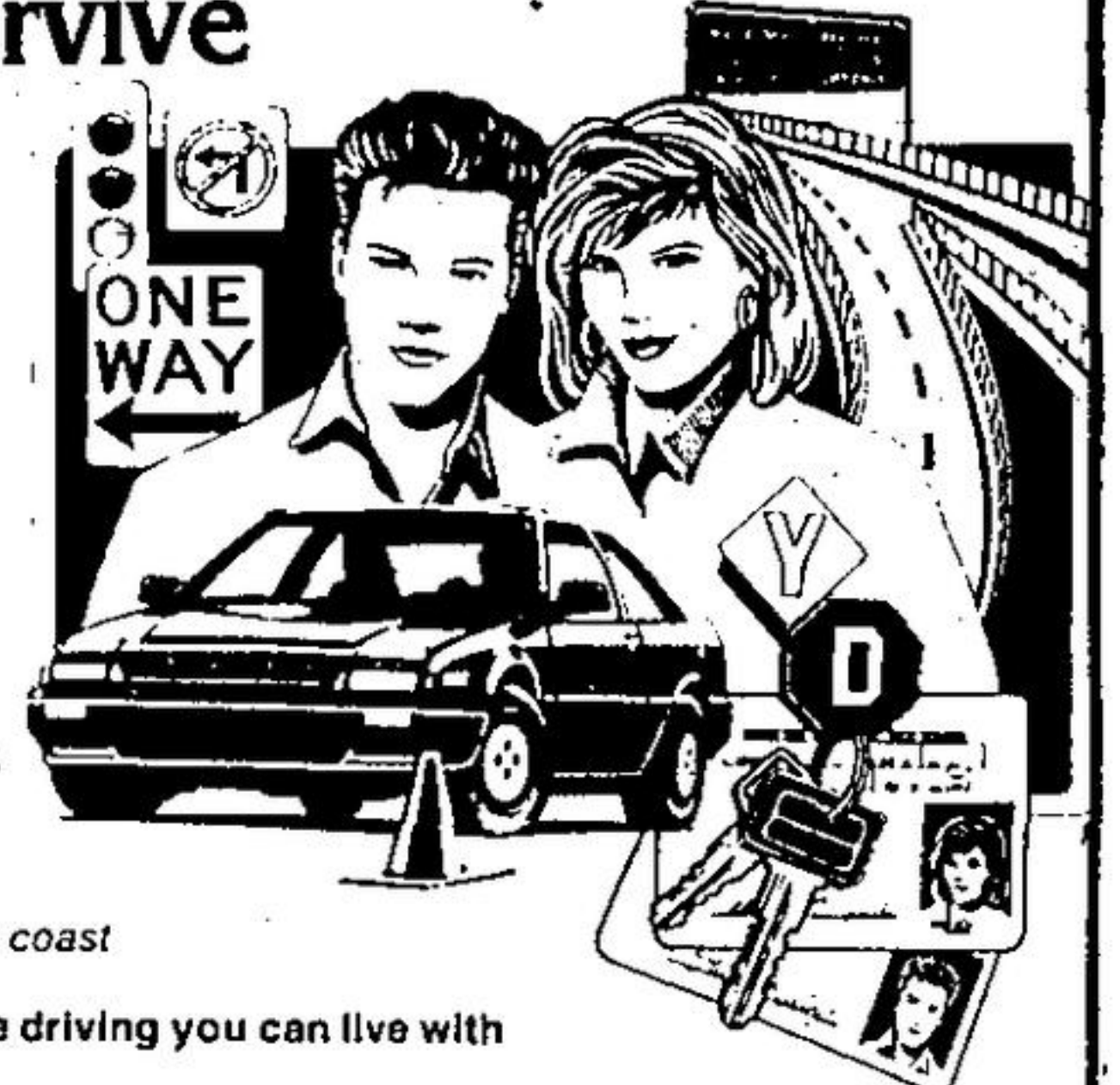

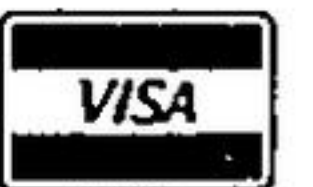
