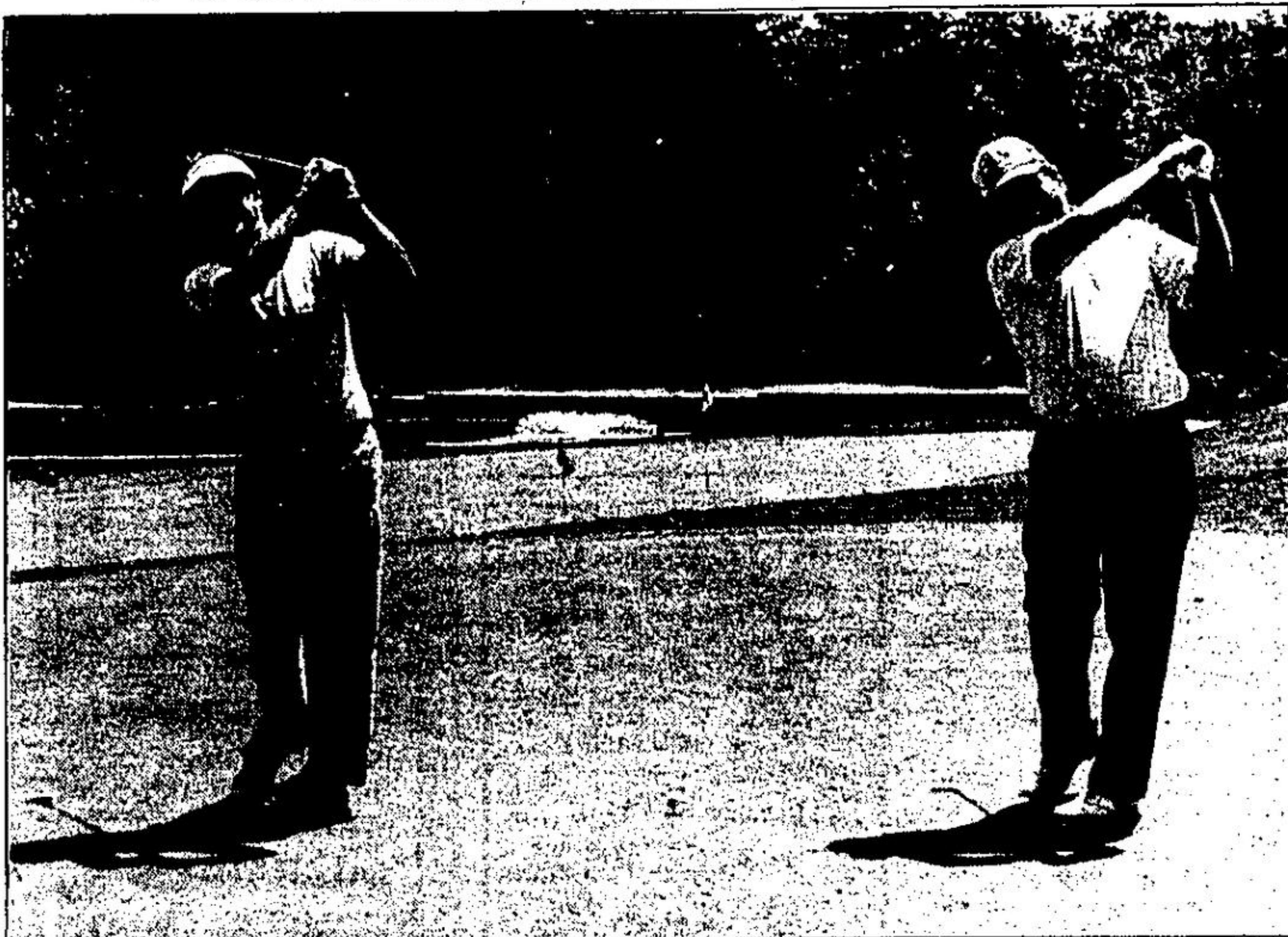
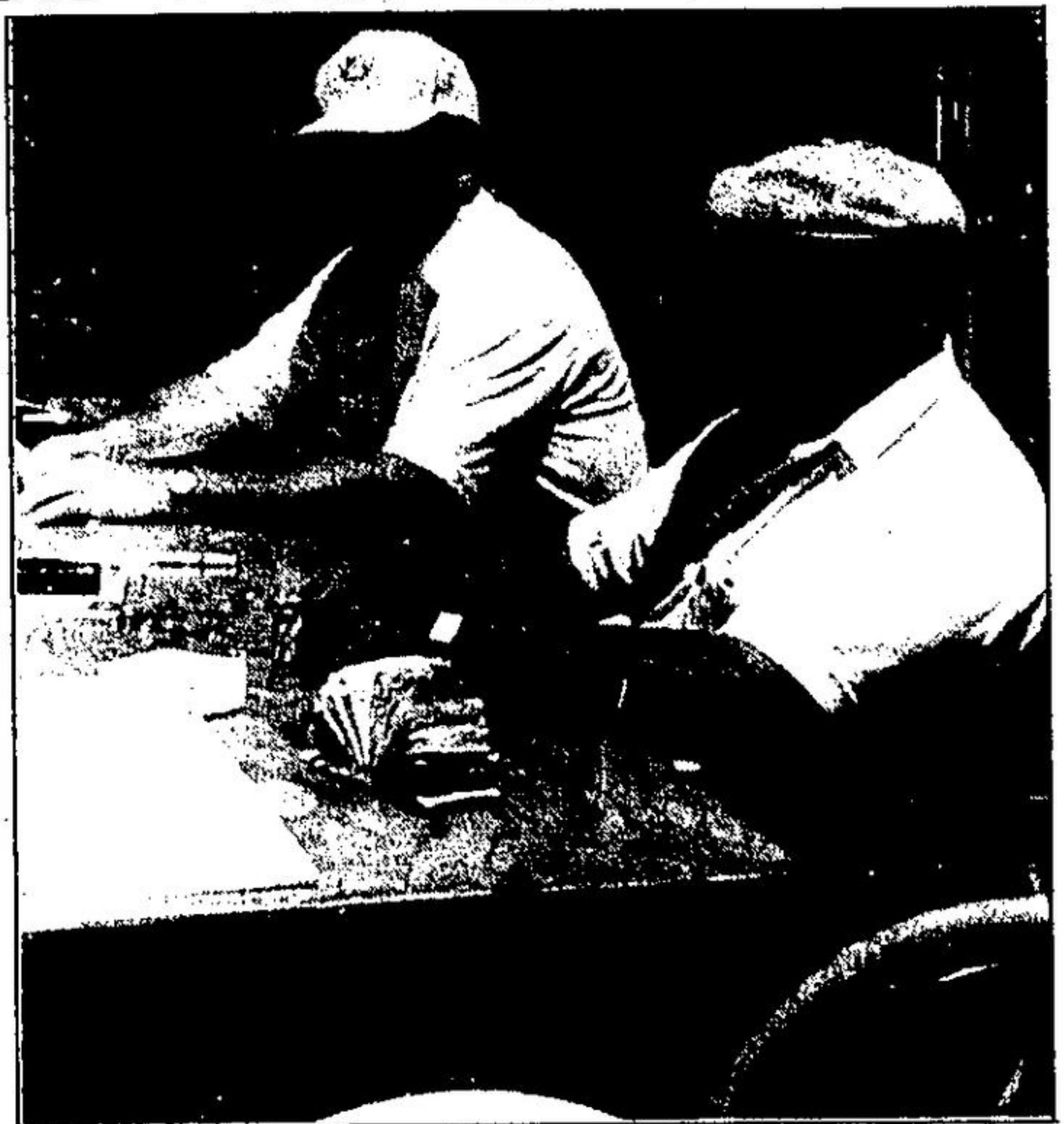


15th Annual Bill Smith Golf Tournament

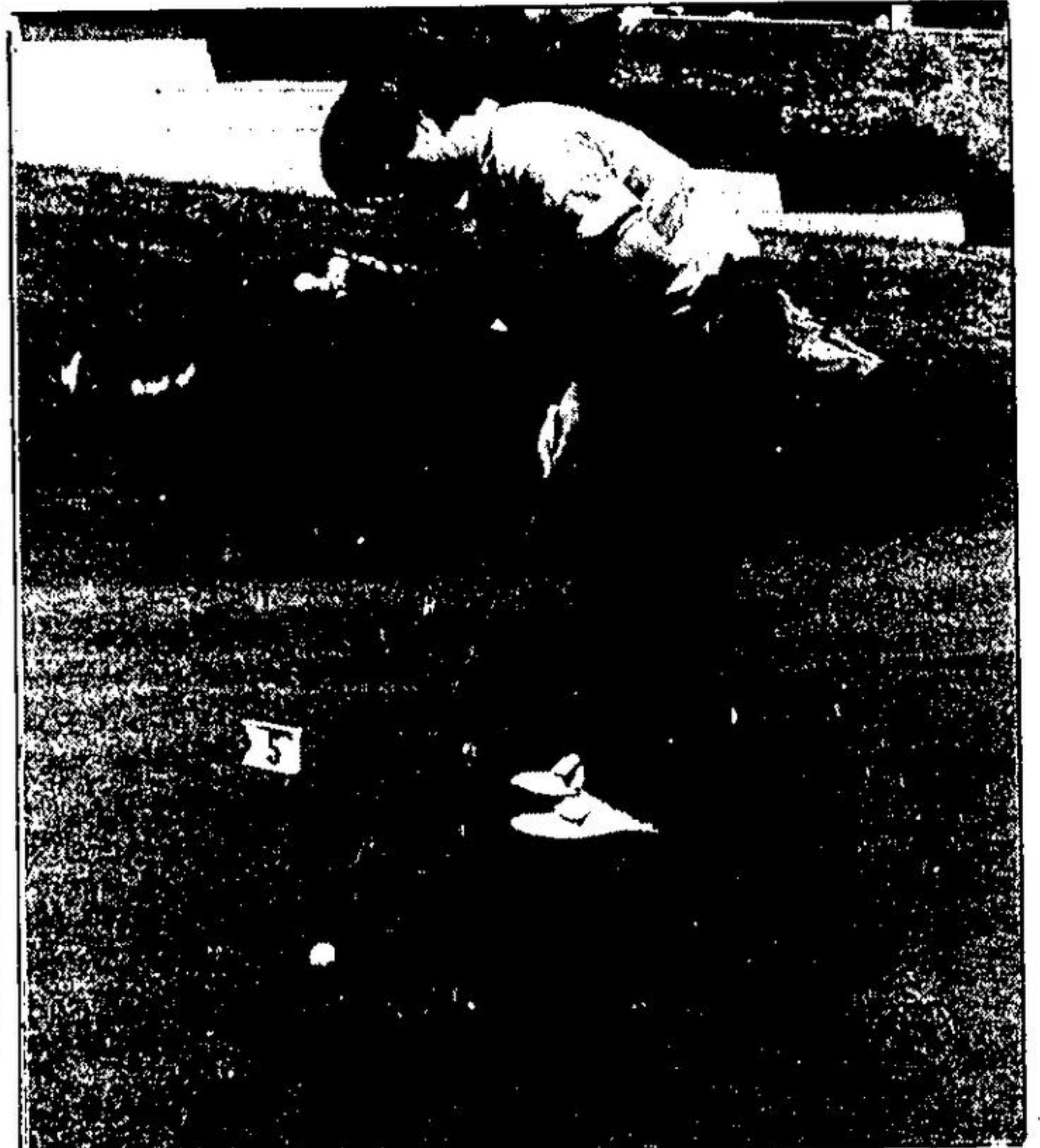
