

The Grand Valley Bed and Breakfast is found in Grand Valley, follow Highway 25 north off Highway 9 to the public school then turn

right at Spruyt to 135 Crozier. The Price is \$65 for one night or \$105 for price is \$27.50 for single and \$42 for two nights. a double.

Orangeville on Highway 136 onto 3rd Price is \$20 for a single bed and \$50 Line Calcdon on the right hand side.
