Bed and breakfasts have become a tradition in this area for the travelling public.

Bed and Breakfast spots dot the landscape of Dufferin County, offering travellers a more homey alternative to hotels and motels.

"The advantage is that they are probably more reasonably priced. You also have somebody to talk to when you stay in someone's home. It's more pleasant to have company than to go to someplace and shutting the door," said Charlotte Sheardown who has three bedrooms for rent at the Camilla Family Farm just outside of Camilla.

"It is a more homelike atmosphere," said Fledda Hillis who operates a bed and breakfast on Crozier street in Grand Valley. "I'm doing it because I enjoy it. It's something different and you get to meet a lot of nice people."

Mrs. Sheardown, who is part of the Ontario Farm Vacation Association (OVFA), pointed out that farm based beds and breakfast stops also help raise public awareness of agriculture.

Travellers looking for a bed and breakfast establishment can find the Camilla Family Farm just outside of Camilla by travelling North on Highway 10 to Camilla than west on 15 Sideroad to 2nd line.

The Grand Valley Bed and Breakfast is found in Grand Valley, follow Highway 25 north off Highway 9 to the public school then turn

right at Spruyt to 135 Crozier. The price is \$27.50 for single and \$42 for a double.  
 The Cataract Inn is South of Orangeville on Highway 136 onto 3rd Line Caledon on the right hand side. Price is \$65 for one night or \$105 for two nights.  
 Millburn House is located off Highway 136 and onto Amelia street. Price is \$20 for a single bed and \$50 for a double.
