

#### HALTON HILLS HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION **Development Charges Proposal Public Information Meeting**

The Town of Halton Hills and the Halton Hills Hydro-Electric Commission are currently undertaking a study in conjunction with C.N. Watson and Associates Ltd. to review and update Halton Hill's development charge policies and practices to ensure their conformity to the Development Charges Act: 1989.

A Public Information Meeting pursuant to Section 4 of the Act will be held to inform the public of the proposal under consideration, to explain the study's purpose, methodology and proposed modifications to Halton Hill's development charges (lot levies) and to solicit public input. The meeting will be held as a Special Council Meeting on July 23rd, 1991. All interested persons are invited to attend the Special Meeting of Council which will be held:

Tuesday, July 23rd, 1991, 7:00 p.m. Council Chambers, Halton Hills Civic Centre, 1 Halton Hills Drive, Halton Hills, Ontario L7G 5G2

A draft copy of the Development Charges Study will be available, on request, from the Finance Department at the Civic Centre during normal business hours, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; it is anticipated the draft report will be available on July 5th, 1991. Written comments must be submitted to the Town Treasurer by no later than Friday, August 23, 1991.

Comments received in writing and those expressed at the Public Meeting will form input to the Development Charges Study Final Report.

The Final Development Charges Study and the new Development Charge By-faw(s) will be brought before Council for their approval at a Special Meeting scheduled to be held Tuesday, September 24, 1991, in the Council Chambers.


