in Japan only see what North
Americans are like through the
movies," said Judith Gooding, a
teacher/co-ordinator with CHI
and member of a participating
family, "Japan is our country's
second biggest trade partner so
it's important for both countries
to learn all we can about each
other."

This type of exchange program for our university students is new to the Toronto area. Similar programs in the United States have met with great success, explained Ms. Gooding.

CHI is a non-profit educational program, founded in 1977, devoted to the growth and understanding among the peoples of the world. Members of the institute believe the best way to eliminate international fears and prejudices is to learn about the cultures, the languages, and the customs of other countries.

Japanese students interested in participating in the program were asked to write an appeal to CHI, and together with certain travel agencies in Japan, the students would be selected. Participating students need only provide travel and personal expenses, their room and board are provided by the family they stay with, known as host families.

Georgetown families wishing to participate in this program (only one Japanese student has yet to be placed for the first three week period) must show sincere interest and be able to provide a bed for the student as well as transportation for the student to and from his/her Study Center, Georgetown District High School.

"I haven't interviewed anyone

who wasn't sincere," stated Ms. Gooding.

Ms. Gooding, who has a 19year-old son at Georgetown District High School will be taking in a Japanese student during the first three week exchange period.

"My son insisted we take somebody," said Ms. Gooding, "He has travelled a lot and is very much for the program."

Cynthia Allan, another teacher/co-ordinator with CHI says she is very excited about a female university student from Japan coming to stay with her.

"I'm pretty excited about it," said Ms. Allan, a sociology and geography student at York University, "I plan on taking her to places like Canada's Wonderland, Niagara Falls, and the Science Centre."

Ms. Gooding also mentions that because Japan is a very expensive country to visit, having a personal contact there would be marvellous for anyone planning to travel.
