

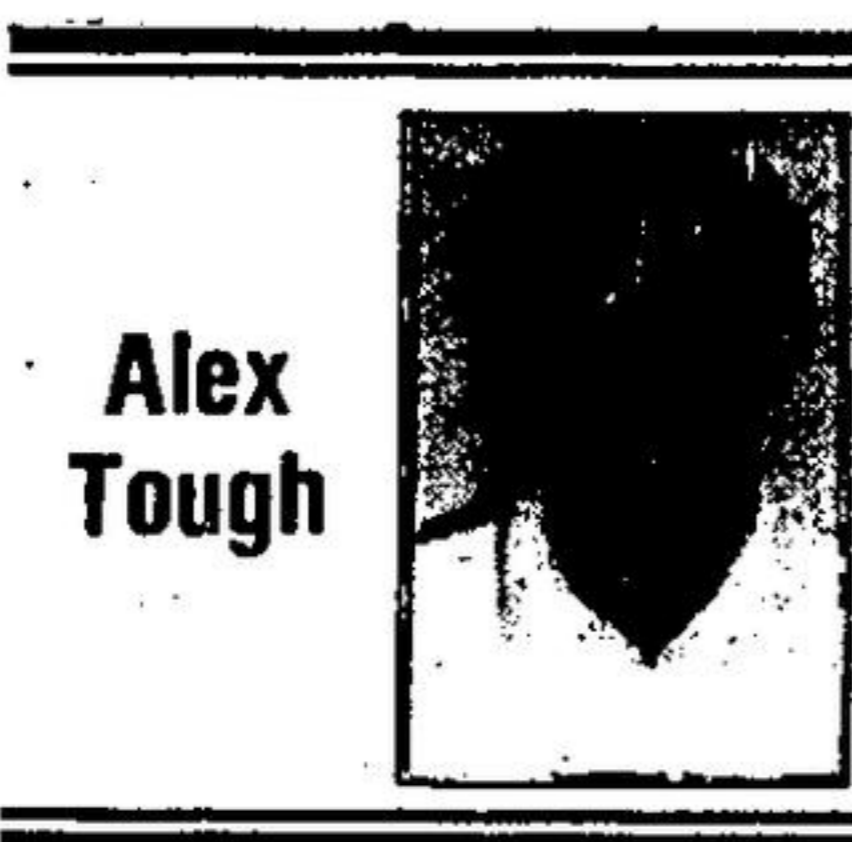

The most successful national manager since the World Cup and therefore, also country, is England. New manager, Graham Taylor, has taken over from Bobby Robson and has yet to be defeated. Furthermore, Robson, now manager of Dutch club Feyenoord, has led his team to a league championship, Robson's first in the game. The Dutch championship went to the wire with both Ajax and Feyenoord in with a chance of winning. As it was both teams won 3-0 on the final day with Feyenoord having a slight goal difference advantage.

Mini-soccer and the objects has been a hot issue with Peel and Halton clubs for a couple of years. Mini has been in existence for a number of years and is primarily designed to give new, younger players more time with the ball on a smaller field. The whole system should develop players skills and techniques without pressure of 'winning' at such an early age. The 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and ten-year-old players should be allowed to enjoy the game without the pressure of parents and coaches to win at all costs. Time enough for that later. There is no doubt that youngsters have the greatest aptitude for learning and this is where the best coaching should be made available.

There are those who do not agree with principles expressed above and they are entitled to those opinions. Mainly, the game and life is very competitive and we should not water the game down. Other sports do not see or have any difference in the size of team squads or playing areas and continue to play in a competitive environment.

We have to land somewhere in between the two beliefs.

The Town of Halton Hills invites you to attend a Public Information Centre to view the design plans for the reconstruction of Maple Avenue in Georgetown. The project extends from the Canadian National Railway Line to River Drive.

This Public Information Centre is the second of two for the project. It will be an informal meeting where plans showing construction details of the preferred scheme will be available for viewing by area residents and other interested parties. The preferred scheme has been selected by using defined evaluation criteria and public comments. 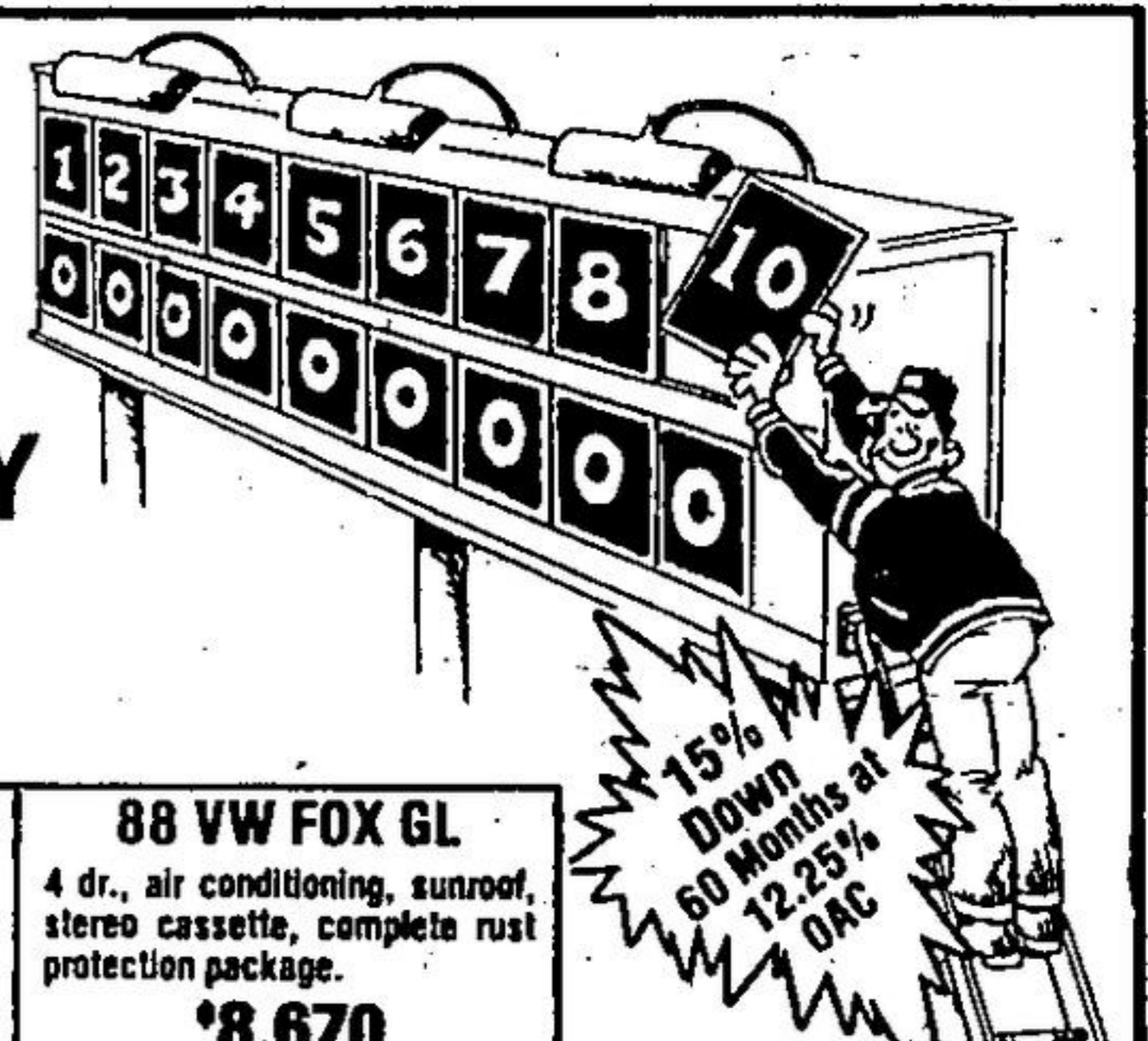
