Sexual assault

A Georgetown man was charged with sexual assault, sexual interference, invitation to sexual touching and anal intercourse by Halton Regional Police July 15. John Vernon Hillier, 21, will appear in Milton Court August 19, 1991.

Charge laid

Halton Regional Police report a Ballinacree man was charged with possession of a narcotic after he was pulled over for a random police spot-check on Main St. near Moore Park Crescent July 16. Police say a strong odour of marijuana emanated from the car when police spoke to the driver. Police searched the car and seized a small bag of marijuana from the hatchback of the vehicle as well as rolling papers and matches from the glove-box.

The 37-year-old man will appear in Milton Court August 26.

Cigarettes stolen

Police say \$3,860 worth of cigarettes was stolen from the Norval Convenience store July 16. The culprits gained entrance to the store by smashing the door

window. They set off an alarm. Police arrived at the scene three minutes later but the culprits had already taken the merchandise and disappeared. Police are continuing their investigation.

A \$1,500 generator was stolen from a rural Georgetown barn between July 16 and 17 police report. All police know is that the unknown suspects used a vehicle to remove the property.

The Jaws of Life were needed to extricate a Georgetown woman from her car after she was involved in a two-car collision at Campbell Gate and Mountainview Road South last Tuesday (July 16) morning.

Police report Margaret Compton of Georgetown sustained minor injuries and was taken to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital by ambulance when her car, a 1985 Pontiac, was struck by a 1984 Ford Mustang that failed to stop for a red light on Campbell Gate.

Police charged the driver of the Ford, a Georgetown woman, with going through a red light.

Halton police offer reward

In an effort to assist the Niagara Regional Police in their homicide investigation surrounding the murder of Leslie Mahaffy of Burlington whose dismembered body was found in Niagara Region June 29, the Halton Regional Police Services Board is offering a \$25,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the persons responsible.

Miss Mahaffy, 14, was reported missing from her Burlington residence June 15. Her dismembered body was found encased in cement in Gibson Lake in the town of Thorold in Niagara Region two weeks later.

She was described as five feet, three inches tall, weighing between 105 to 115 pounds with long, blond hair, blue eyes, and braces on the top and bottom teeth. The night she disappeared, she had been wearing a white, long sleeve, silk blouse, beige walking shorts, a brown leather belt and

flat, white, casual shoes.

Halton police are asking that if anyone has information pertaining to the murder, to call the police service at (416) 878-5511 or the special investigation line (416) 639-2511 or call Crime Stop-

pers at 1-800-668-5151.

The identity of the person supplying the information will be treated as strictly confidential.

The reward is payable in Canadian funds and expires on July 16, 1992.
