

Theatre announces upcoming line-up

Georgetown Little Theatre, the Community Theatre in Georgetown, today announced some of the results of their audience survey. The survey was taken during last season's production run and came up with some amazing results. Among these were:

SEX: Almost 50 per cent of the respondents were male, while slightly more than one half were female. There were an insignificant number who didn't know.

FUN: When asked to rate various factors for enjoyment, and with a maximum rating of 5, the audience average was 4.321.

The conclusions, then, are that the average audience member was 50.3 per cent female and 49.6 per cent male, and that 86.42 per cent of each of them (corresponding to the part above the knees)

enjoyed themselves. (Numbers may not add up to 100 per cent due to rounding, which happens to many people if they don't exercise enough.)

The season 1991/92 promises to be an exciting one, and it begins on Oct. 25 with "Steel Magnolias", a compulsive drama set in a Southern hair salon. The play explores the relationships between five gossipy women and offers a mixture of laughter and sadness. In January the comedy "Opera Comique" is to be presented. The setting is the opera house on the opening night of Bizet's "Carmen". The Parisian upper classes are shown to be capable of scandal and deceit appropriate to a good farce. The final play of the season is to be "The Curate Shakespeare". This is based on the idea of a curate

staging "As You Like It" with minimal resources. The result is a hilarious view of the world of amateur theatre.

The tickets can be purchased in advance on a subscription basis. This represents a considerable cash saving - \$21 for all three plays, on the night of your choice. Regular ticket price would be \$10 each (Fri or Sat) or \$8 each (Wed or Thurs). In addition, the tickets will be issued to subscribers as soon as they are printed, assuring you, in advance, of some of the best seats in the house.
