#### Jewelry stolen

Halton Regional Police report unknown culprits stole \$4,775 worth of jewelry from a Raylawn Crescent home in Georgetown July 18 after slipping the lock on the front door to gain entry. Police say the thieves didn't vandalize the place and only removed items from the master bedroom. Police are continuing their investiga-

#### Assault charge laid

A Milton man has been charged with assault and breach of probation after a Georgetown woman alleged she had been slapped by the man outside of the Hollywood Tavern Saturday. Police say the woman alleged she was slapped across the left ear and neck area. The man will appear in Milton Court Aug. 26.

#### Stolen credit card

Police are looking for a man and woman riding a motorcycle who are believed to have made \$4,500 worth of purchases on a stolen credit card Sunday. Police say the suspects bought \$300 worth of leather goods from a leather goods store in Acton with the card that wasn't listed by VISA as a stolen credit card. A short time later, the suspects entered the Olde Hide House, also in Acton, and attempted to purchase leather goods but when the clerk called VISA to validate the card, the company told her it was stolen. Police say the suspects then became suspicious and fled the store with the card. Police are still investigating.

#### \$400 damage

Unknown suspects broke three windows in Georgetown High School July 17 to gain entry but nothing was stolen, police report. Police say the culprits used garbage bins to break two outside windows to gain entry to the school and broke one window in-

side but never entered the inner halls where motion detectors set off an alarm. Damage is estimated at \$400.

#### Equipment stolen

The Glen Williams business, Black Box Radio Remote Controls, had a \$12,000 communicator test set stolen from its workshop between July 16 and 17, police report. The device is used to test different radio equipment. Police say the company is in receivership and several employees have been fired recently. Police are continuing their investigation.

#### **Property stolen**

Police say the monetary value of iems missing from a Raylawn Crescent house in Georgetown that was broken into July 18 will be significant but haven't calculated the exact figure. Police say unknown culprits entered the house by applying pressure to the front door and once inside, entered all rooms, removing property from each, The culprits also visited the kitchen and consumed some food.

#### Man charged

Metro police arrested a Rexdale man and charged him with assault after Halton Police were told the accused assaulted a Georgetown woman at her home July 13. The 31-year-old man will appear in Milton court Aug. 26.

#### Two arrested

Police have charged two Toronto area men with possession of stolen property and use of a stolen credit card after they purchased \$505 worth of cigarettes from the Speyside General Store in Halton Hills Sunday with a stolen credit card. A clerk at the store called police after confirming her suspicion that the card was stolen. Police stopped the vehicle they were driving after it left the store and found the cigarettes in the back seat of the car. Both men appeared in Milton court July 22 for a bail hearing.

## Fire Calls

Halton Hills firefighters responded to only two calls over the weekend, both coming Friday evening.

The first call came from Sideroad 5 just west of Ninth Line where a motor vehicle accident had occurred. When Halton Hills firefighters arrived, the driver was out of the vehicle and there was no fire. Firefighters were only required to cut the battery cable to the car.

Shortly after, firefighters responded to a call on Maple Avenue. A broken fuel line had resulted in gasoline leaking from a car and firefighters were needed to wash the vehicle down.
