Inn around 12:00 noon.

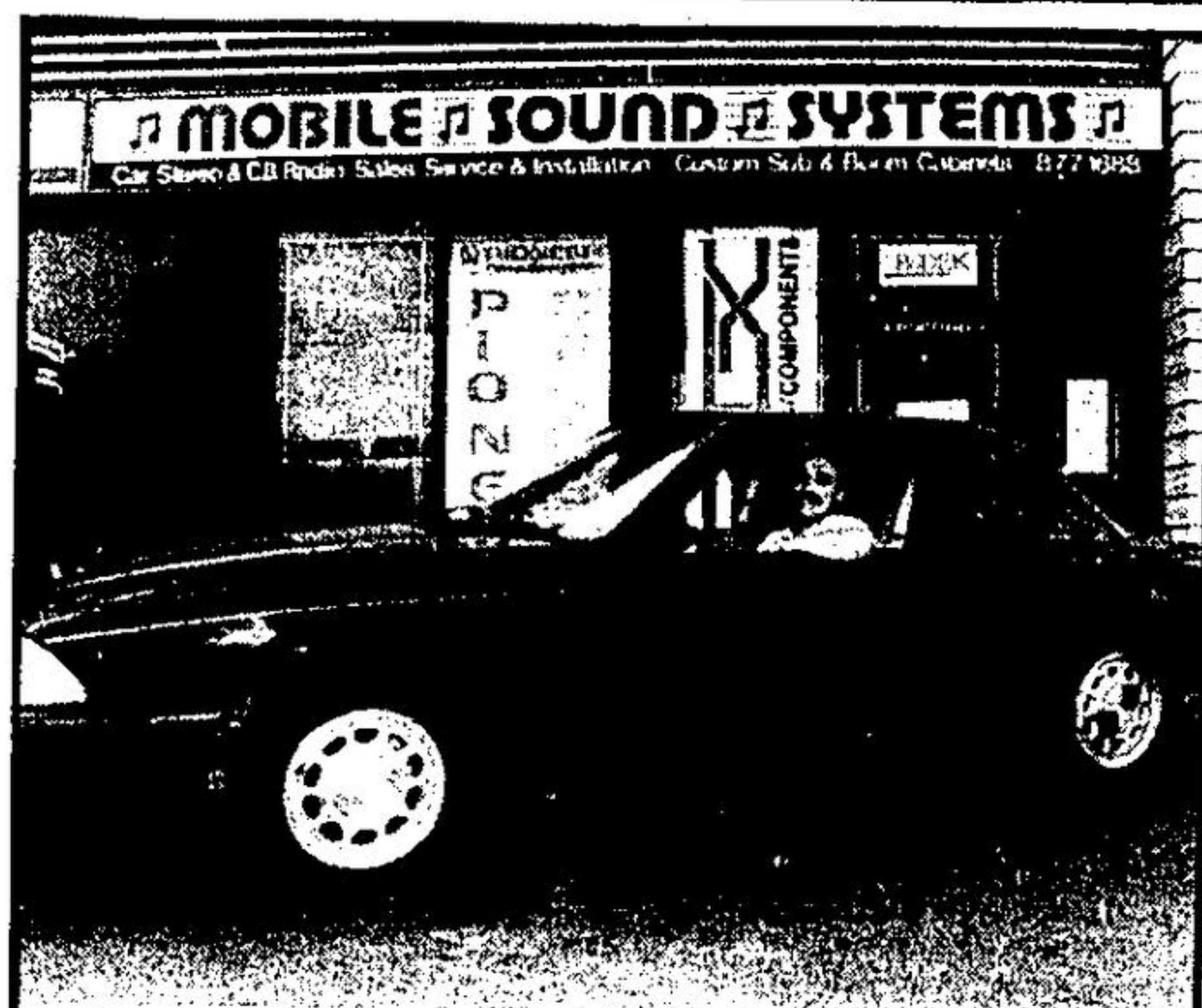

HELP US FIND A NEW LANDFILL SITE

On April 2, 1991, The Honourable
Ruth Grier, Minister of the Environ-
ment, made a policy announcement concerning
the disposal of waste produced in the Greater
Toronto Area (GTA) which affects you.

Your garbage is currently disposed of in the
Britannia Road site where capacity is rapidly
running out. That's why the Interim Waste
Authority Ltd. (IWA), formed by the provincial
government, is undertaking a planning process
to locate a new landfill site within Peel Region.

The IWA needs your suggestions about how to
find an environmentally suitable landfill site to
serve your community, and the residents of
Peel Region.

Public open houses will soon be held in your
area to help you learn more about the search
process and to get your suggestions.

The Draft Approach and Criteria document fully
outlines how the IWA proposes to conduct the
search for a new landfill site. This document is
subject to a 60-day public review period.
