Grant requests being evaluated

recommendation that information concerning Ministry of the Environment Water and Wastewater Capital Grant Requests be received for evaluation was passed by Halton Region's Planning and Public Works Committee Wednesday morning in Halton Hills.

On September 30, 1990 Halton submitted applications for Direct Grant (grants to remedy existing water pollution problems) and Lifetime Grant (grants to replace existing infrastructure) to the Ministry of the Environment for various water and wastewater capital projects. All the Direct Grant requests were denied with the exception of Zebra Mussel Control Program.

The Ministry has approved three projects to date for funding under the Lifetime Grant Program. There still remain several water and wastewater projects outstanding that may receive funding under the Lifetime Grant Program this year should additional funds become available

(due to the inability of other municipalities to use their allocation prior to the April 1st cut off date).

The 1991 Capital Budget only presumed Ministry Direct Grant funding for two projects, namely-Glen Williams and Bridgeview. These projects will not commence until Ministry funds are available.

Regional funding for the Glen Williams project is currently in place. It is anticipated the contract will be ready for tender sometime in January 1992, which will coincide with any MOE grant funding the Region may still receive during this fiscal year.

Regional funding for the Bridgeview project is currently in the Capital Budget Forecast for 1992. The detailed design will be completed for tender prior to the April 1st deadline. This will allow the Region to proceed with the projects within the MOE's fiscal 1991/92 fiscal year, should provincial funding become available.




