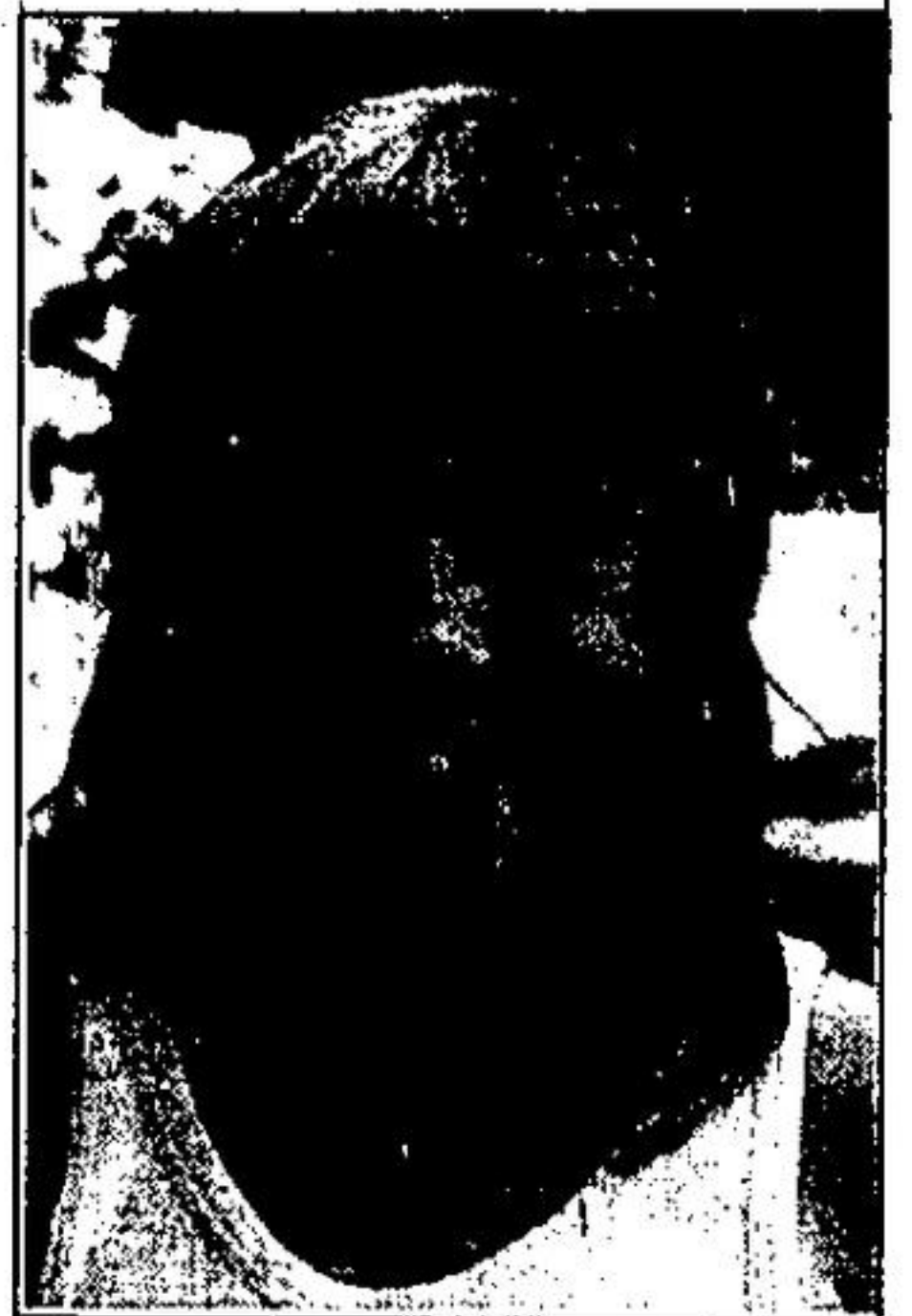
## Rainy day activity suggestions?

Vacations are best when planned well in advance. Which means you're too late.

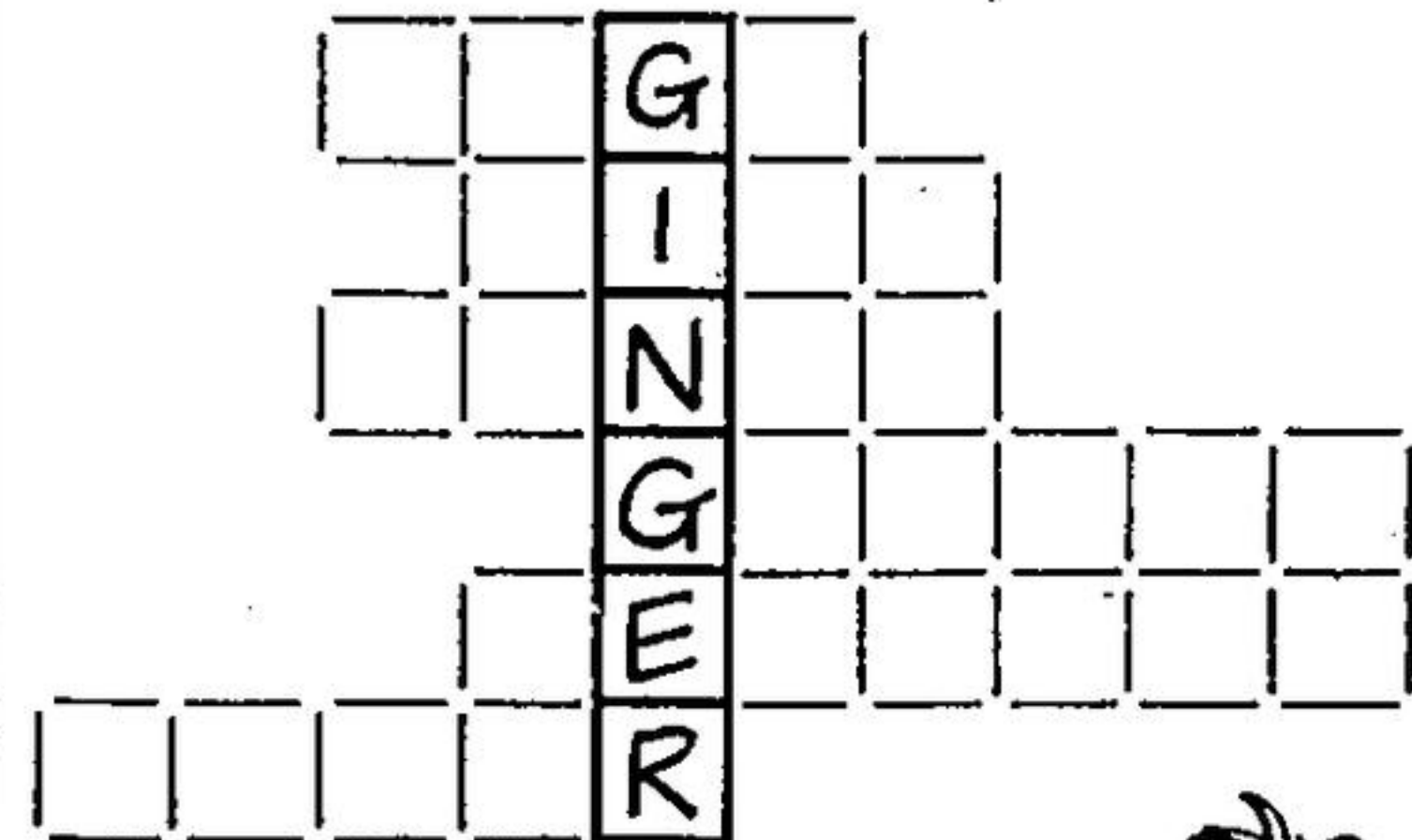
The federal government is going to save 400 million dollars by reducing ammunition stocks for the Armed Forces. Soldiers are now learning how to yell 'boo!'
