Service Officers Report

An article in a semi annual F.S.N.A. newsletter prompted this reminder to all our readers of the importance of securing family records, and in particular those records which may create delays in processing claims

regarding estates for surviving members of families.

Records of deceased members who were veterans of Canada's Armed Forces, can be most important if there are claims after the fact, i.e.: Funeral expenses, Last Post Fund, Spouses allowance. Service related documents and after service employment records can mean the difference in processig successful and timely claims.

I would suggest that a safety deposit box would be a secure method of retention, for such documents as, Certificates of service, Discharge documents, including health or pension records and employment records.

All surviving members of a family should be made aware of any decisions regarding safe storage, thus sparing heirs unnecessary stress. .
