It seems if you keep calling, the government will eventually listen. .

Revenue Canada has been receiving numerous calls from Bill and Pauline Stout of Acton and from Halton-Peel M.P. Garth Turner expressing their anger that a computer foul-up deprived the Stout's of their GST credit cheque in July.

The Stout's who are both on disability pension, started calling Revenue Canada when they didn't receive their cheque in the mail. Getting no answers, they contacted Mr. Turner who called on their behalf and discovered that a computer operator had incorrectly punched the Stout's earnings at \$214,431 when in fact, the couple made less than \$23,000 last year.

But with the incorrect figures, the government decided the couple wasn't eligible for a GST credit.

The mistake was soon corrected but the Stout's were told they would have to wait until October, when the second batch of GST credits are sent out, to receive the credit.

However, Mr. Stout didn't want to wait. "Why should I have to wait," he said. "I didn't make the mistake." He was counting on the cheque to help pay overdue bills.

So on his behalf, Mr. Turner urged Revenue Canada to cut a
