Runs from Anthony, Dave Lyons, Arnold, Lajeunesse, Ryan Bailey, Mark Bailey and two from Scully, along with a homer by Andrew Coe finished it off.

The Georgetown Fairground Armouries area was the scene of a battle Friday night.

The bottom of the first inning saw Eric Fullum and Mark Mitchell each hit triples while teammates Carl Elgin and Joel Koeslag walked. Expos were leading 5-0 at the end of that inning.

Elgin went home on an error at the bottom of the second inning, giving the team another run.

Later, Tiger Jeff Edwards knocked in fellow player Scott Wilson. A 6-1 score placed their team in the record books for the

first time that night - in the top of the third inning.

In the top of the fourth, Expos thought they tasted victory when Mark Dodson and Ryan Handford came in prior to a three-run homer by Dave "Skippy" Vanderbyl. Driving in Dave Weiburn, the team came out of the inning with a 7-6 advantage over Tigers.

Elgin and Fullum then scored two runs for the red and white Expos. At the bottom of the fourth inning, they were winning 9-6.

A sacrifice run by Greg Horner brought in teammate Mark Boucher at the top of the fifth inning, closing the gap between Expos and Tigers by two runs.

In the bottom of that inning, Elgin ran a double for Expos, wedging his team ahead of the Tigers 10-8.

Tigers fought back in the top of the sixth inning, despite earlier threats of rain on the diamond.

A 10-10 tie resulted when Handford was able to hit Jerry Saunders into the game, coming in off Mark Dodson.

Expos Marcel Blais scored a double in the bottom of the same inning. The score was 12-10 for his team.

Even after Tigers managed to score three runs and base hits by Wilson, Horner and Jason Duke, Expos Koeslag and Blais scored one more run before closing the game on a tied note.
