weekend.



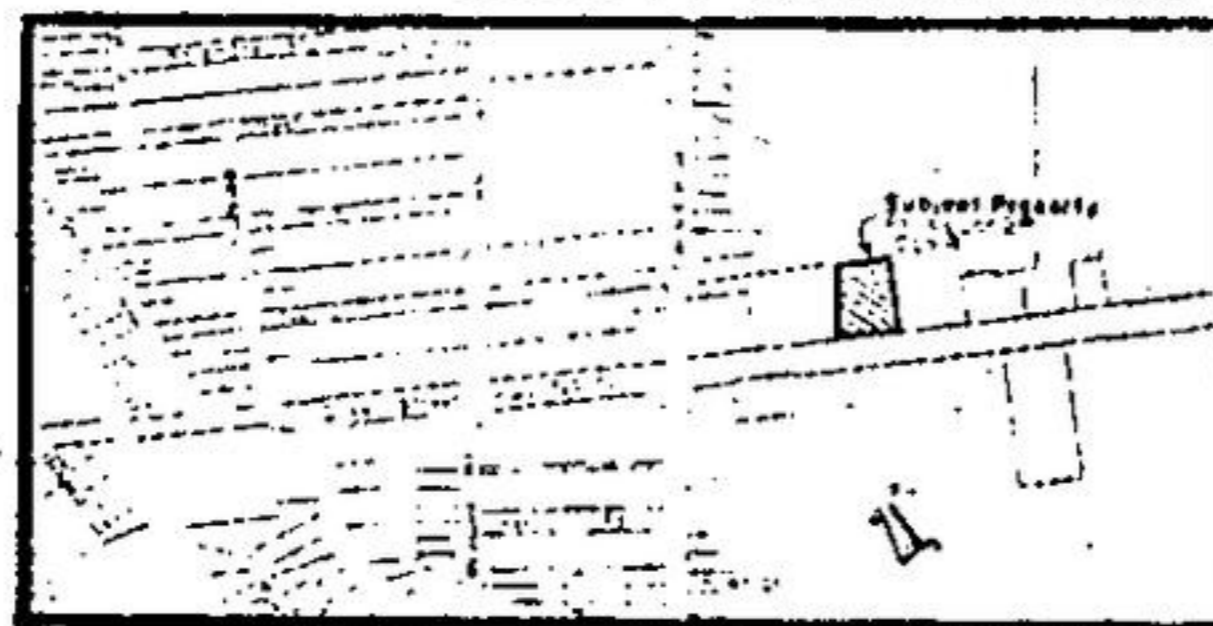

Class Document Review & Revision

Notice of Review GO Transit is reviewing its Environmental Assessment Class Document (Class EA), a condition required when the current document was approved in 1988 by Ontario's Minister of the Environment.

The Class EA document outlines the process for assessing the environmental impacts of activities undertaken by GO Transit and for ensuring that impacts are addressed and minimized, in compliance with Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act. Generally, GO Transit activities covered under the Class EA document include the construction of new commuter rail stations and bus terminals, and the expansion of existing commuter rail stations, bus terminals, and storage and maintenance facilities or yards.

Review agencies, representatives of interested or affected groups or agencies, and members of the public will be consulted during revision of the Class EA document. Opportunities will be provided for concerned parties to provide input throughout the review. Besides this notice, the public will be notified when the revised draft Class EA document is completed, anticipated for the spring of 1992.

Individuals and groups are encouraged to submit comments or questions about the GO Transit Class EA document and the current review at this early stage to ensure that all interests are known and issues raised.
