Two heart-stopper extra innings in the Gold Championship game blew GBA record books wide open.

1st - Expos opened by bringing home a Dan Whitton single, thanks to an Adam Stoyles sacrifice. Stoyles, pitching for Expos, held Jays scoreless for the first two innings despite singles by Alan Gilmour and Paul Larocque in the first and second, respectively.

2nd - Jeff Mienen's single, followed by Jesse Vien's walk, set up Hob May

for a key double which brought in the two runners. May then reached home on an overthrow, making it 4-0 Expos.

3rd - Expos managed two singles - Whittan and Ed Alcorn - while Jays' Dylan Lee cracked a clean double; but pitchers Simon Ford and Mike Budget refused either side the advance to home.

4th - Jays were again shut out while Expos brought in a run to lead 5-0.

5th - Jays retaliation started innocently as Budget, walked to first and advanced by a Larocque single, came home on an overthrow. Both sides retired on a bases-loaded situation: Larocque, now pitching for Jays, threw strikes for the third out, while Jeff Mienen, pitching for Expos with the tying run at the plate, induced a pop fly.

6th - Justin Hunt owned the inning. From the mound he shut down three Expos batters; his double in the bottom half put Jays one run behind.

7th - Against Hunt, Expos gained two hits yet could not score. Dylan Lee's single brought in Andrew Peden for the tying Jays run but a key out at the plate put Jays away.


