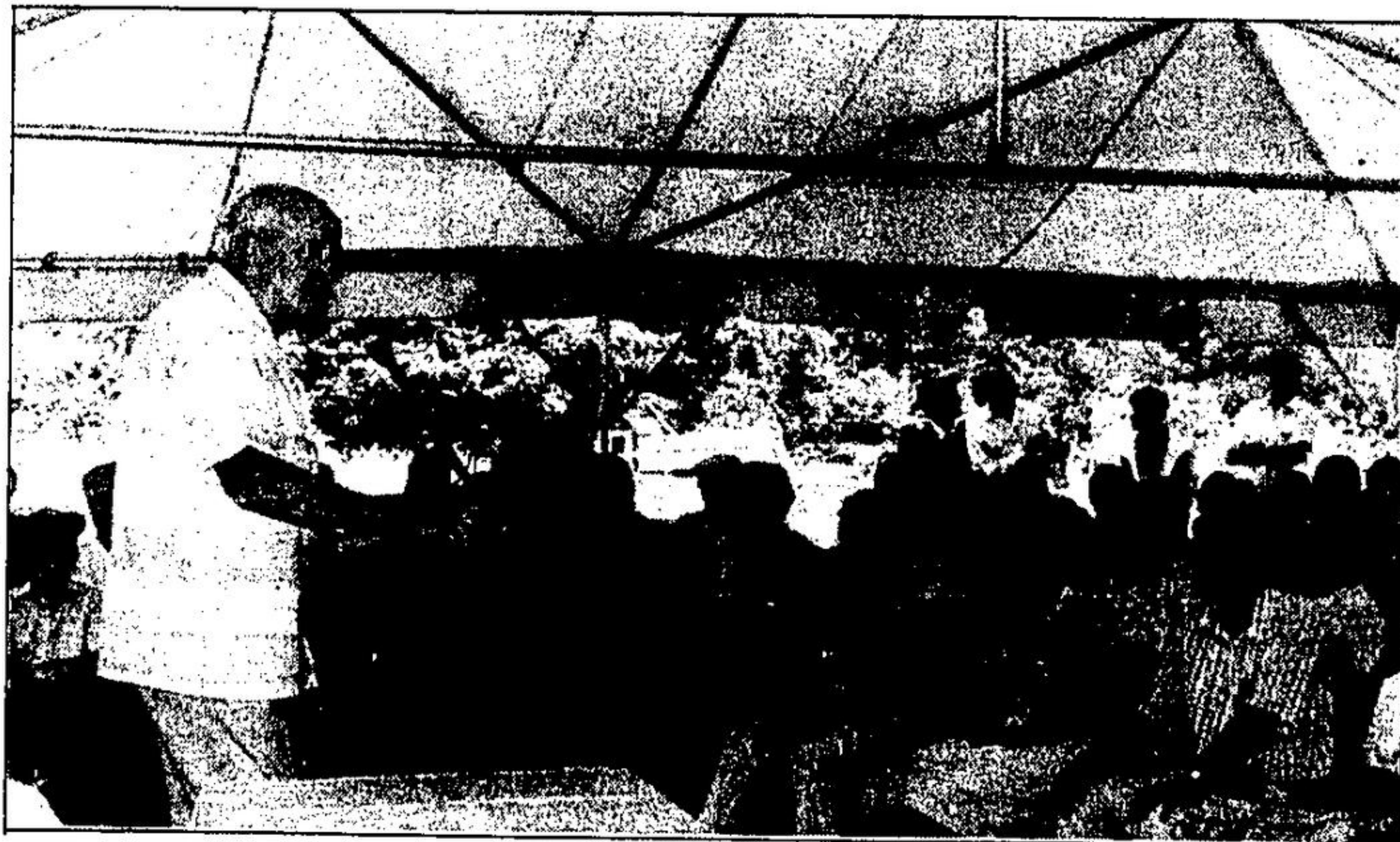
**Happy Hills campers**
