DRAW YOUR OWN TIGER HEAD!

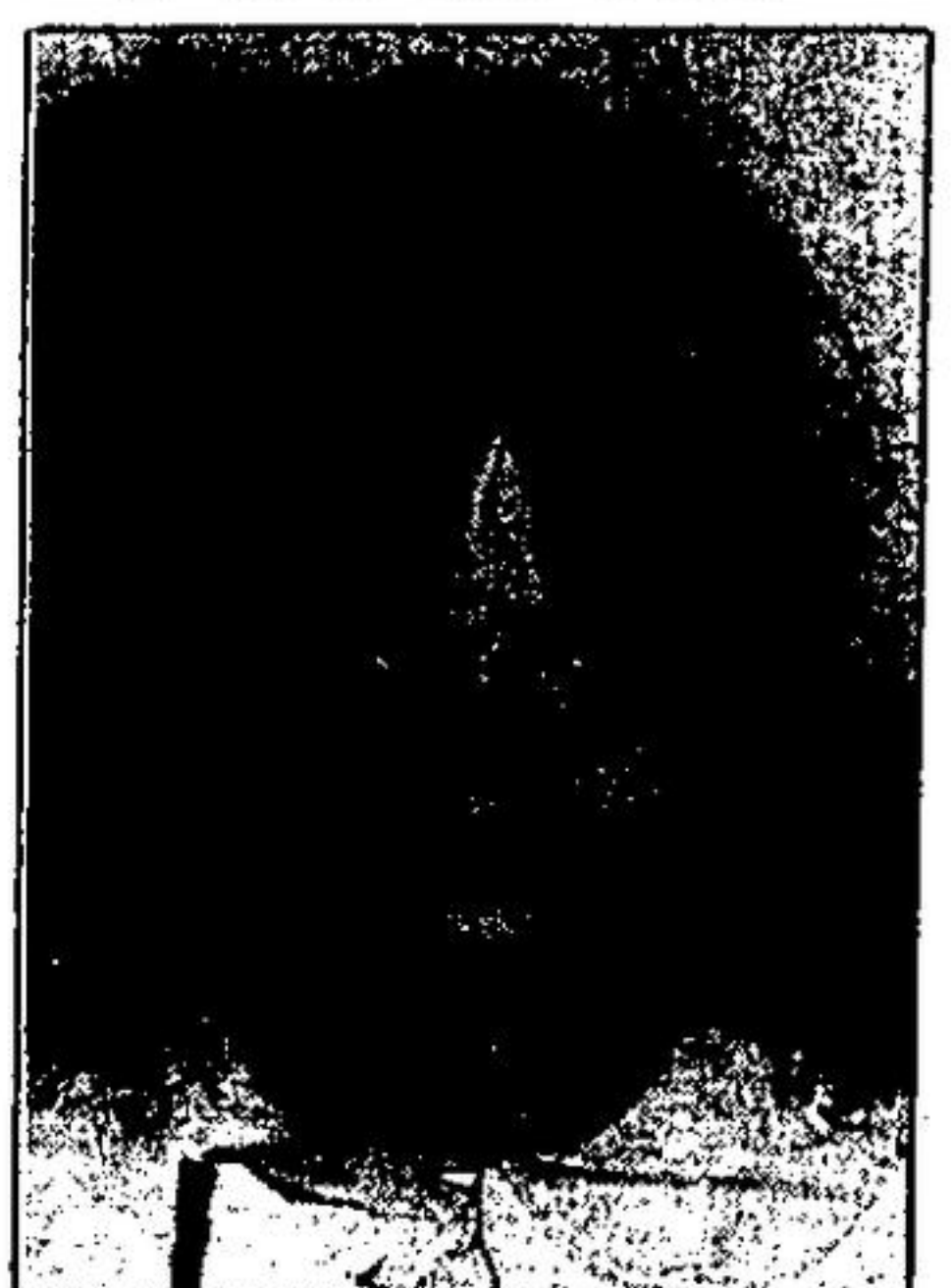

Prince Edward Island residents are talking again about a fixed link. But they want the bridge to go to Barbados.

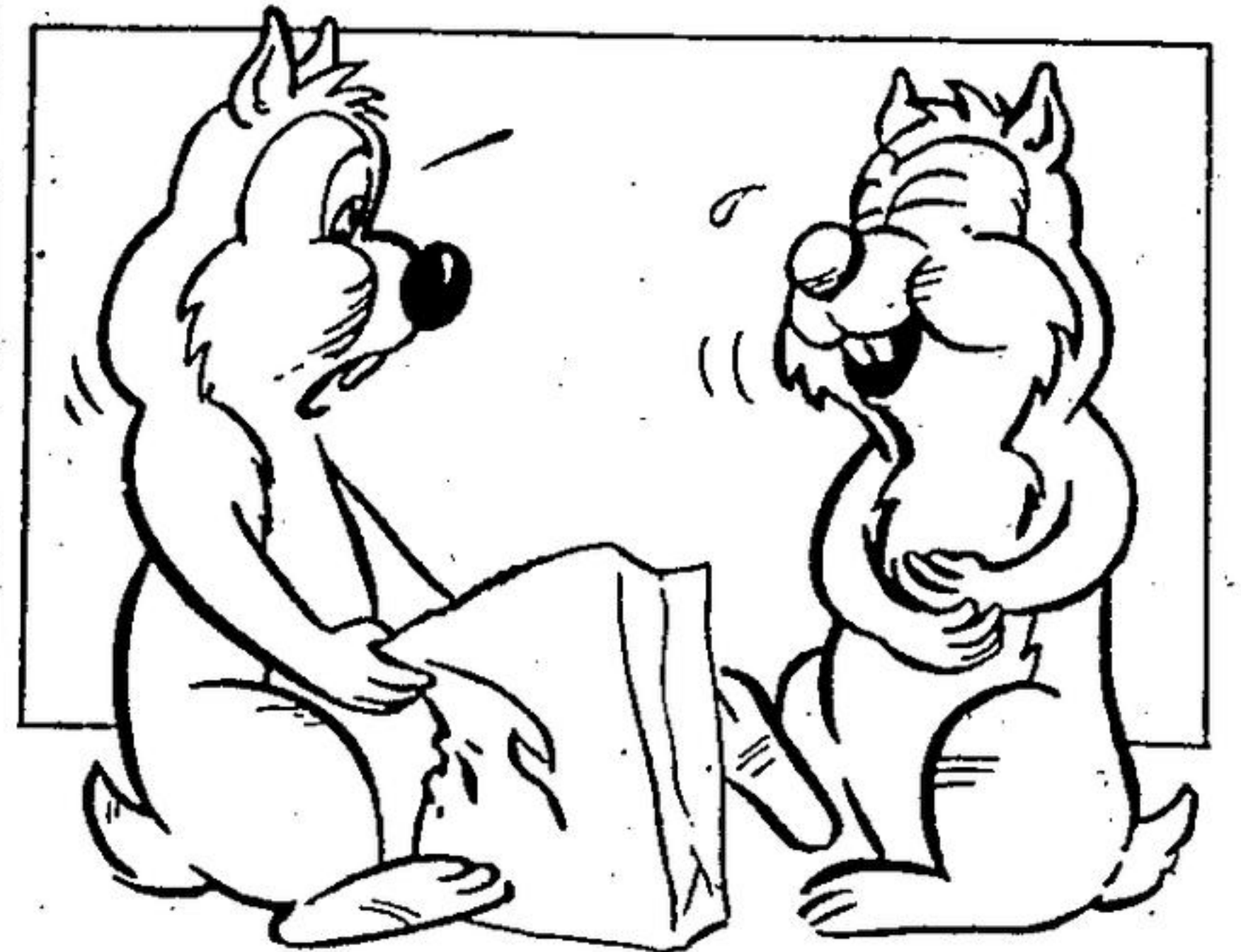
Airlines are going to crack down on illegal smokers. People who are caught trying to sneak a cigarette in aircraft wash-rooms will be put on the next flight to Regina.

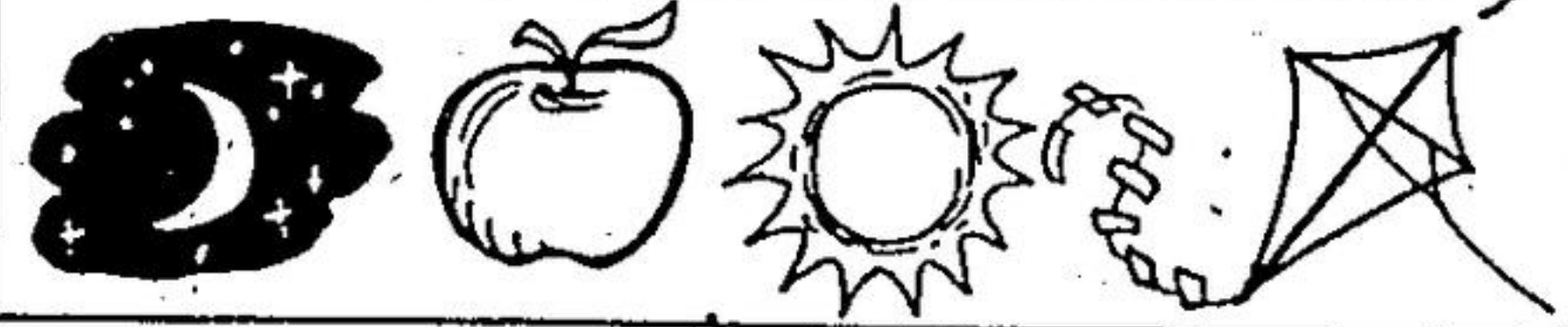
It is traditional in weddings for the father to give away the bride. He cannot, therefore, charge GST.
